

Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment increased by 1.4% from the Fall 2019 semester to the Fall 2020 semester. This reflects a 1.5% increase in undergraduate enrollment and a 0.7% increase in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students decreased to 32.6% of total enrollment compared to 32.2% in Fall 2019.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 11. hours which is a decrease from 11.9 in Fall 2019. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 7.1 hours, which is a decrease from 7.2 in Fall 2019.

(Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

Top Six Parishes



Livingston Parish had the largest percent increase in graduate students with an increase of 24.3%.
