


Semester Registration Report Fall 2021

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Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 7.9% from the Fall 2020 semester to the Fall 2021 semester. This reflects a 8.8% decrease in undergraduate enrollment and a 2.7% increase in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students decreased to 30.1% of total enrollment compared to 32.6% in Fall 2020.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 11.6 hours which is a decrease from 11.8 in Fall 2020. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 7.0 hours, which is a decrease from 7.1 in Fall 2020.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score increased to 22.4 as compared to 22.2 in Fall 2019.

Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught decreased 8.6% from the Fall 2020 semester to the Fall 2021 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

Top Six Parishes


