



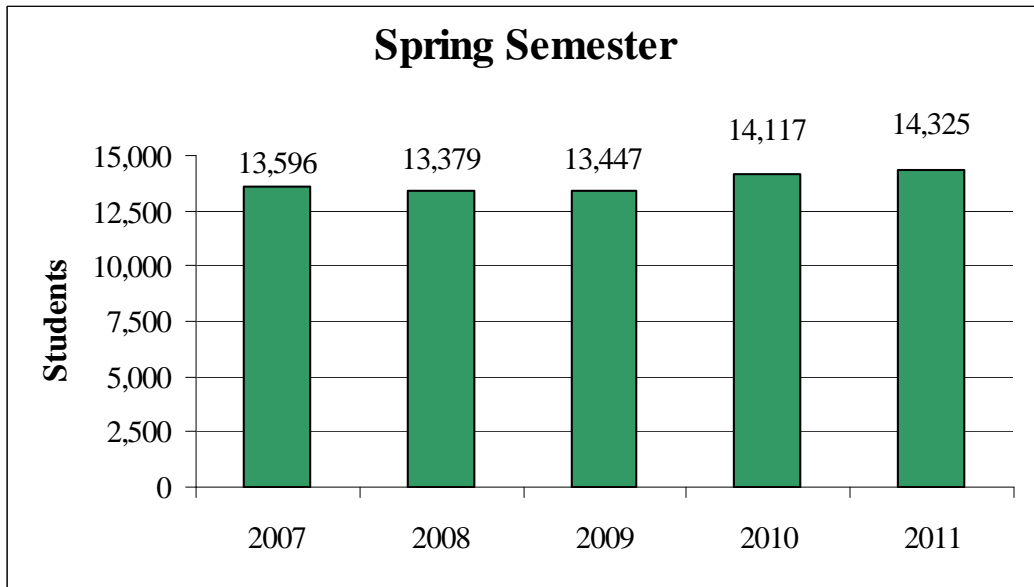
Semester Registration Report

Spring 2011

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Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment increased by 1.5% from the Spring 2010 semester to the Spring 2011 semester. This reflects an increase of 1.9% in undergraduate enrollment and a 2.1% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students increased to 24.0% of total enrollment compared to 21.2% in Spring 2010.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 12.8 hours which a decrease from 13.0 in Spring 2010. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 6.5 hours, which a slight increase from 6.4 in Spring 2010.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score decreased from 21.2 in Spring 2010 to 20.8 in Spring 2011.

These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

Top Six Parishes

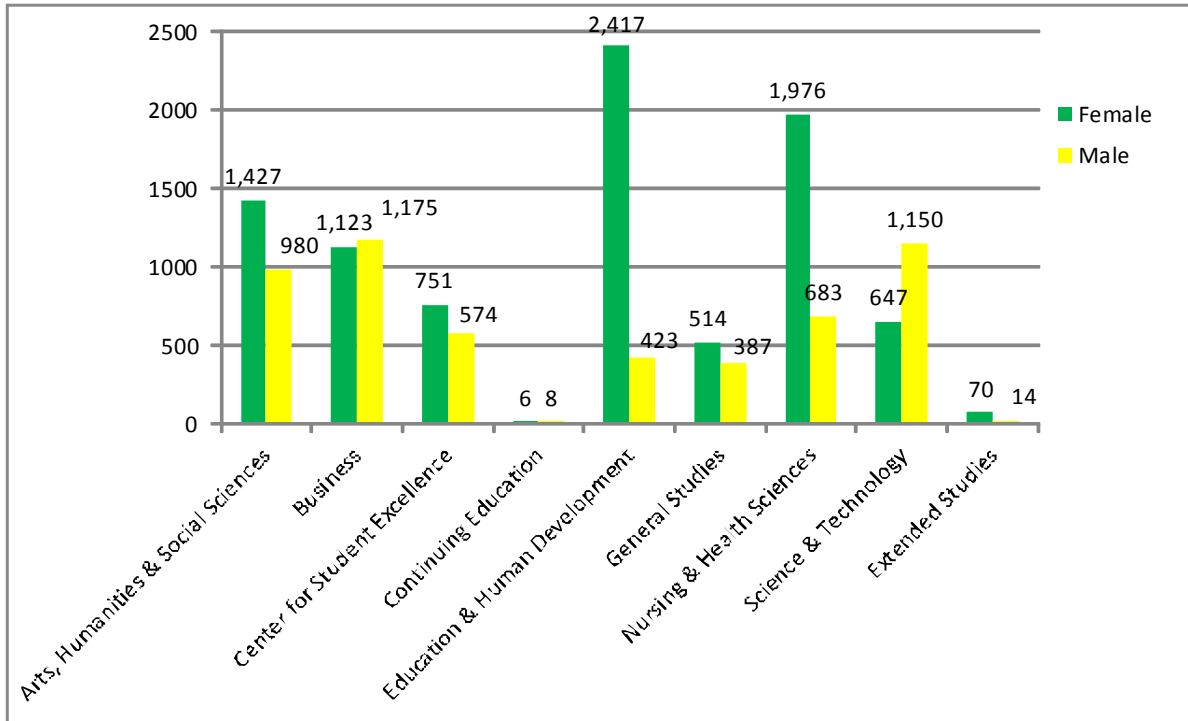
