

Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 1.9% from the Spring 2020 semester to the Spring 2021 semester. This reflects a decrease of 2.6% in undergraduate enrollment and a 7.7% increase in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students decreased slightly to 30.9% of total enrollment compared to 31.0% in Spring 2020.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 11.4 hours which is a decrease from 11.5 in Spring 2020. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 7.0 hours, which is a slight decrease from 7.1 in Spring 2020.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score decreased from 22.1 in Spring 2020 to 20.7 in Spring 2021.

Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught decreased 3.1% from the Spring 2020 semester to the Spring 2021 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

Top Six Parishes


