



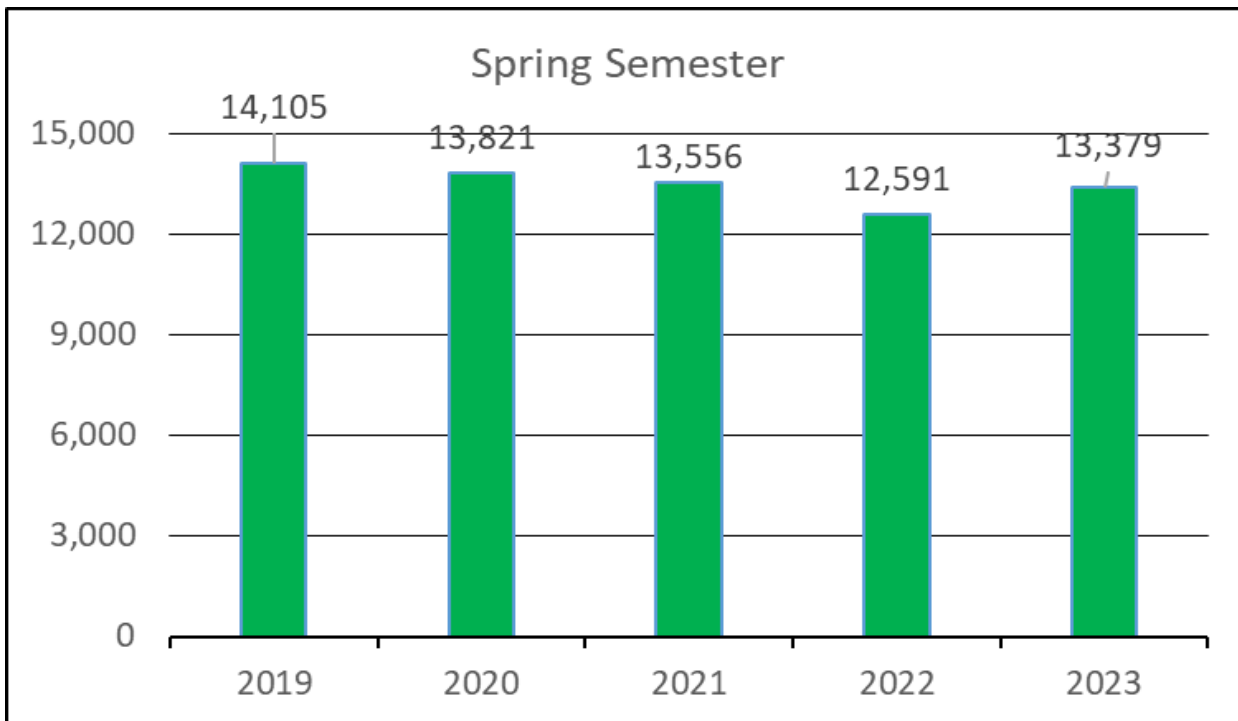
# *Semester Registration Report*

## *Spring 2023*

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### Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment increased by 6.3% from the Spring 2022 semester to the Spring 2023 semester. This reflects an increase of 6.4% in undergraduate enrollment and a 4.5% increase in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



## Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students increased to 28.8% of total enrollment compared to 28.2% in Spring 2022.

## Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 10.8 hours which is a decrease from 11.4 in Spring 2022. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 7.3 hours, which is an increase from 6.9 in Spring 2022.

The average ACT Composite score increased from 20.7 in Spring 2022 to 22.0 in Spring 2023.

(Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

## Top Six Parishes

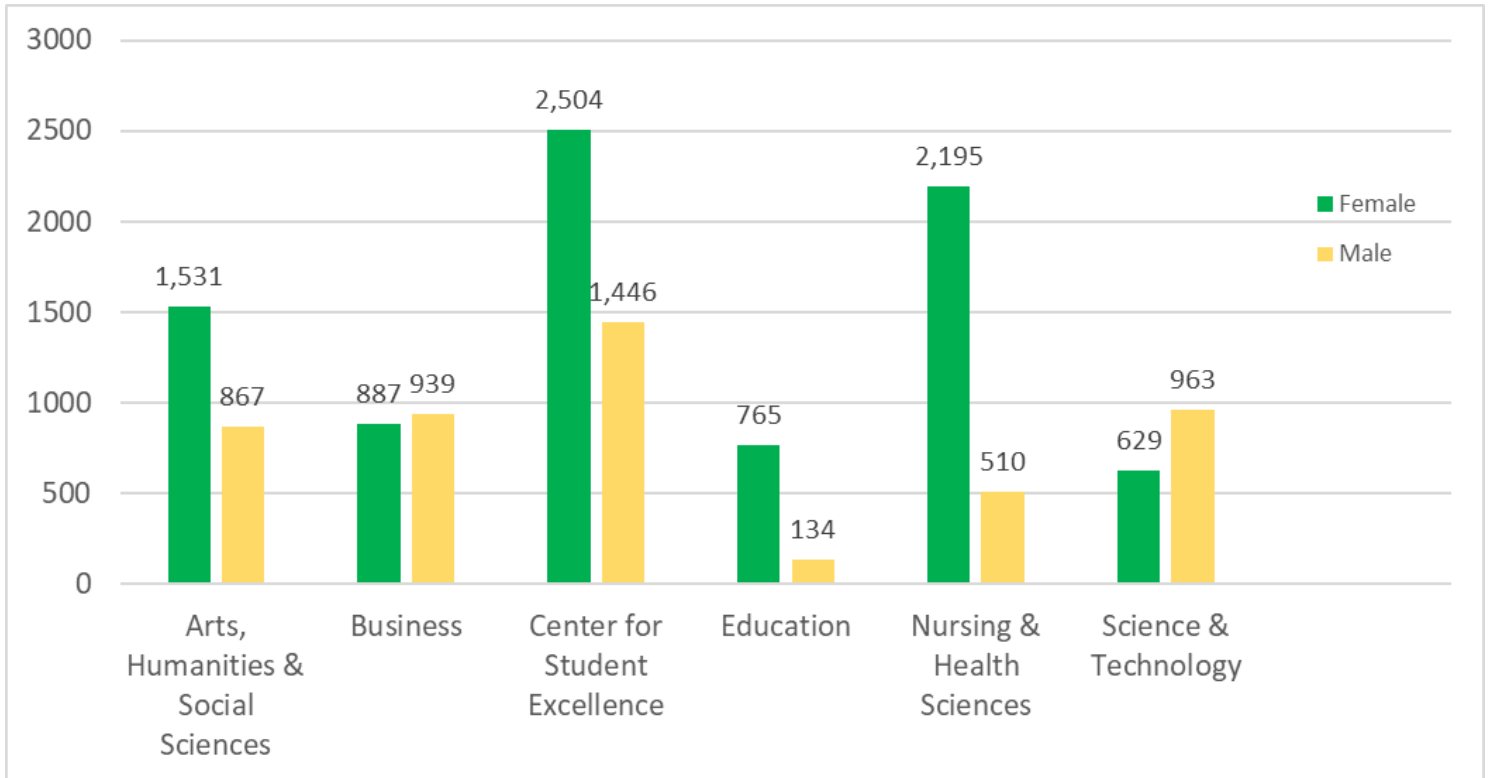
