



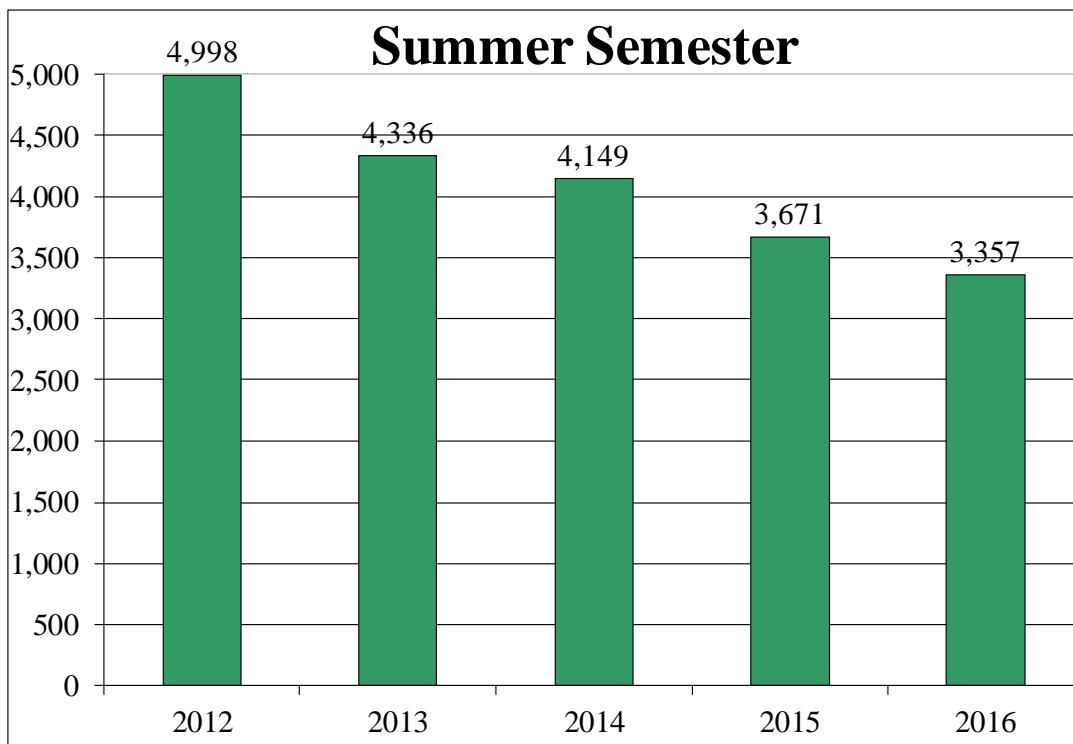
# *Semester Registration Report*

## *Summer 2016*

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### Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 8.6% from the Summer 2015 semester to the Summer 2016 semester. This reflects a 8.2% decrease in undergraduate enrollment and a 10.0% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



## Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students decreased slightly to 32.3% of total enrollment.

## Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 5.4 hours, which is exactly the same as Summer 2015. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 4.7 hours, which is a decrease from 4.9 in Summer 2015. In Summer, a full-time undergraduate student is enrolled in 6 or more hours and full-time graduate students in 4 or more hours. Part-time undergraduate students are enrolled in less than 6 hours and graduate students in less than 4 hours.

## Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score increased from 22.6 in Summer 2015 to 22.7 in Summer 2016.

## Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught decreased 9.6% from the Summer 2015 semester to the Summer 2016 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 6, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 4.

## Top Six Parishes

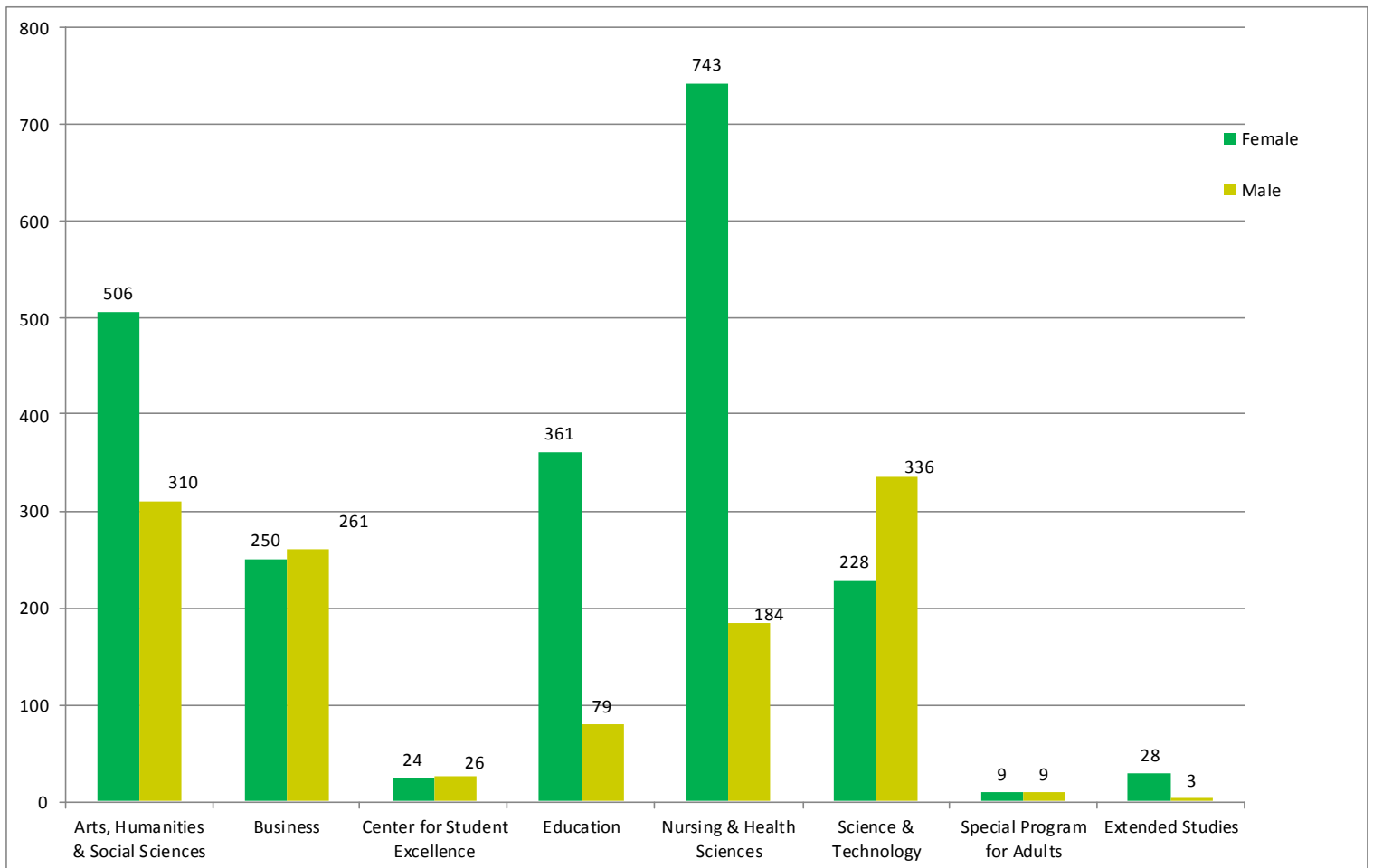

Livingston had the smallest percent decrease in graduate students with a decrease of 3.1%.
