We have some of the most dedicated staff members to serve your needs, not only today but throughout your college career. I am proud to partner with these departments who play a tremendous role in our students' success.

I would like to start with the dedicated staff at our University Counseling Center. The staff are on-call 24 hours a day to assist our students in need. College can be a very stressful time in one's life. Dealing with COVID, having some of your classes being taught online, the stress of deadlines, achieving high grades, and overall social pressures can be overpowering. If one starts feeling weighed down with their responsibilities, there is no shame in reaching out for help. The Office of Student Accessibility Services facilitates the process of academic accommodations for students with disabilities. Their staff works with students to get accommodations necessary for you to become a successful student and achieve greatness. You must register with Student Accessibility Services to receive these accommodations. If you have a question or believe you need an accommodation, you can contact this office, and they will be more than happy to assist you.
