The purpose of this special meeting was to discuss a proposal (attached) by Dr. Joseph Licata concerning a Pilot Program for a concentration in Educational leadership within the Master's Degree in Curriculum and Instruction. Because this program involves state certification for school administrators, the BESE board must approve it. The urgency of the special meeting was due to the necessity of presenting the proposal for approval to the Bureau of Teacher certification by January 30, 1998. The bureau of Teacher certification will then place the proposal on the agenda for the February meeting of the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education.

During discussion after a motion was made to approve this pilot program, it was decided to amend the proposal as follows:

FORUM MODULE ONE: Eliminate EDUC 647 and replace with Marketing 695 from Module Five.

FORUM MODULE FIVE: Add SPED 602, "Best Practices in Special Education" in place on Marketing 695.

The proposal was approved 11 votes for to 1 vote against.

It was noted that the proposal will be submitted through the remainder of the University Governance committees if the BESE Board approves.
