



Graduating Class Profile Academic Year 2007-2008

Executive Summary

Each summer, the Office of Institutional Research and Assessment prepares the Graduating Class Profile Report. This year's report contains information on the 2007-2008 academic year graduates. Basic demographics are included as well as information on how long the graduates had attended Southeastern and from which institutions students transferred.

During the 2007-2008 academic year, Southeastern conferred a total of 2,183 degrees, a slight decrease of 4 (0.2%) degrees from the 2006-2007 academic year. Eighty-three percent (83%) of baccalaureate degree recipients were White, Non-Hispanic, while sixty-six percent (66%) were female.

Some highlights from the tables include:

- Sixteen percent (16%) of the graduates who started as beginning freshmen attended Southeastern for four (4) years, which is two percentage points less than the 2006-2007 graduating class. Over twenty-six percent (26%) of the transfers attended for four (4) years, while twenty-four percent (24%) attended for three (3) years.
- The modal number of years at Southeastern was five for beginning freshmen and four for transfer students.
- Southeastern's leading feeder school was Louisiana State University – Baton Rouge, followed by Baton Rouge Community College, Delgado, University of New Orleans, River Parishes Community College, and Southwest Mississippi Community College. The top feeder schools for the 2006-2007 graduating class were Louisiana State University – Baton Rouge, followed by Baton Rouge Community College, Delgado, University of New Orleans, Northwestern State, and University of Louisiana-Lafayette.
- The undergraduate program with the highest number of graduates in 2007-2008 was the B.G.S. in General Studies. This program was followed by B.A. in Management, B.S. in Nursing, B.S. in Accounting, and B.A. in Marketing. In 2006-2007, it was the B.G.S. in General Studies, B.A. in Management, B.S. in Nursing, B.A. in General Business, and B.A. in Marketing.
- The baccalaureate majors (at least 5 graduates) with the highest percentage of students who began as transfers were General Business, General Studies, and Finance. In contrast, the majors with the lowest percentage of transfers were Kinesiology, Criminal Justice, and Communication Sciences and Disorders.
- Sixty-three percent (63%) of the baccalaureate degree recipients started at Southeastern as beginning freshmen.
