Southeastern freshmen are less likely to come to class prepared.

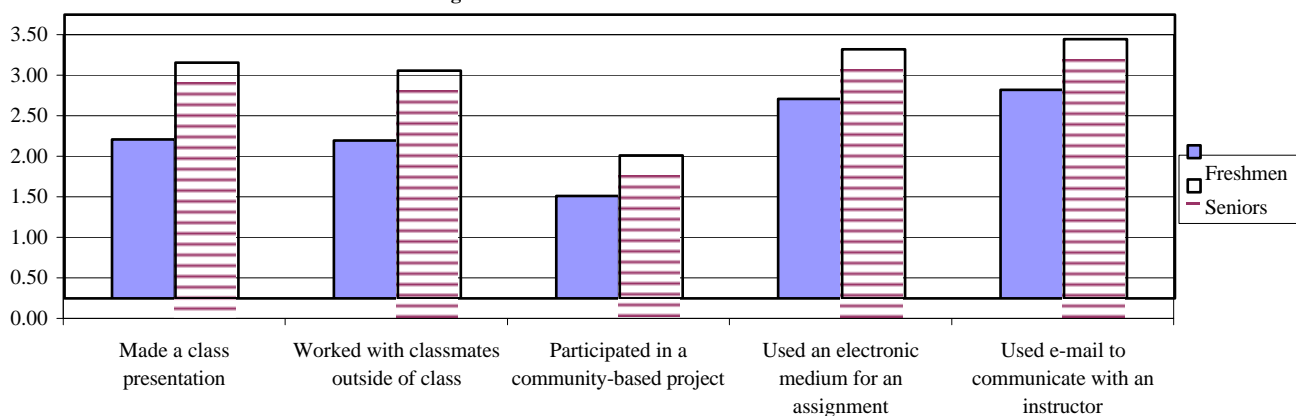
Southeastern freshmen are less likely to make a presentation in class.

Southeastern requires more re-writing.

Southeastern seniors use more electronic media.

Southeastern seniors have more conversations about classwork, but work less with faculty outside the classroom.

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Points of Note:

Satisfaction with advising is comparable to other institutions as freshmen but significantly worse for seniors.

Seniors participate in practicums and/or internships and community service to a greater degree than freshmen plan.

Seniors participate in foreign language and study abroad to a much lesser degree than freshmen plan.

Significantly fewer seniors have participated in a culminating senior experience than seniors at other institutions.

Significantly fewer seniors took foreign languages than did seniors at other institutions.

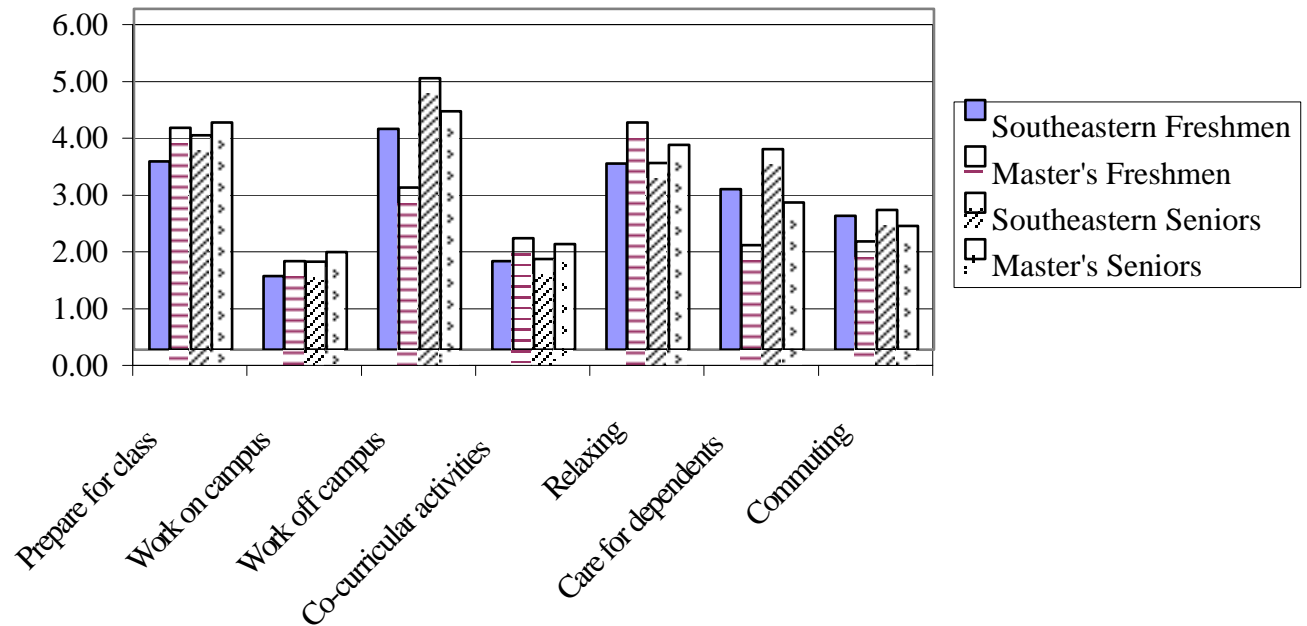
