not interested in specializing in a particular field of study should enroll
in the Curriculum in Liberal Arts Studies. The major and minor requirements
will be considered filled upon the completion of 24 semester hours in English and 24 semester hours in one of these subjects: communication, criminal justice, dance-performing arts, a foreign language, political science, history, mass communication and journalism, music, philosophy, psychology, sociology, social work, theatre, visual arts. A student may not claim a minor in English or the second humanities field. Members of the Department of English will advise students who pursue this curriculum.
An adjusted grade point average of 2.0 is required in each of the two major subjects, averaged separately.

Orientation 101 is not required of transfer or readmitted Southeastern students with 30 hours or more.
${ }^{1}$ Students must complete 12 hours of a single foreign language. ${ }^{2}$ Students may fulfill this requirement in one of the following:
a) produce a note from a teacher certifying successful completion of an

English course scheduled in a computer lab;
b) successfully complete English 322, 445, or 448;
c) successfully complete the English Department?s computer literacy test.

NOTE: Students choosing option 2 must also complete a three-hour free
elective.
${ }^{3}$ Students must complete a minimum of 6 hours plus requisite
laboratory courses in a two-semester sequence of a biological science plus
a physical science and the requisite laboratory (excluding Chemistry $106)$
or a two-semester sequence of a physical science (excluding Chemistry 106) plus a biological science and the requisite laboratory. ${ }^{4}$ Students may elect a course in Anthropology, Economics,

Geography, Political Science, Psychology, or Sociology, excluding Geography 205.
${ }^{5}$ Pre-Law students who choose to complete the first year of law school to meet the fourth year elective requirements must meet the requirements set forth in the Pre-Legal Study section of this catalogue.

Successful completion of the first year of law school will be accepted as
one of the two required major subject areas.
${ }^{6}$ Students must use some of these general electives to
complete the 24 hours of another subject area offered in the humanities.

These subjects are: communications, criminal justice, danceperforming
arts, a foreign language, Political Science, history, mass communication
and journalism, music, philosophy, sociology, social work, theater, visual arts.
${ }^{7}$ Students may take only 6 hours of 200 -level English courses.
