## - Political Science

The major objectives of the Department of History and Political Science are
(1) to provide all students with general humanistic knowledge in the fields of history, political science, and philosophy;
(2) to aid them through this knowledge to analyze and interpret problems and achievements of past and present societies;
(3) to further their intellectual development through opportunities to think, to speak, and to write logically and analytically;
(4) to prepare them to become dynamic citizens who understand the structure, powers, and procedures of national and state governments and have some knowledge of other world governments as well; and
(5) to provide specific background training for such professions as law, journalism, government service, and teaching.

Students who wish to prepare for graduate study in History or Political Science or for law school should consult with the head of the department.

## Major in History

Thirty-six (36) semester hours are required for a major in History. At least twenty-four (24) of these hours must be in 300 or 400 level courses.

## Major in Political Science

Thirty-six (36) semester hours are required for a major in Political Science. At least twenty-seven (27)
of these hours must be in 300 or 400 level courses.

## Minors

Twenty-four (24) semester hours are required for a minor in History and Political Science. Eighteen (18) semester hours are required for a minor in Philosophy. The philosophy minor consists of twelve hours at the 300 -level and six hours at the 400 -level. The Department of History and Political Science offers a minor in International Studies. A minor in International studies consists of eighteen hours: six semester hours of a single foreign language at the 200-level or above; three semester hours from Group 1; three semester hours from Group 2; and six semester hours from Group 3.
