DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE

The purpose of the Department of Sociology and Criminal Justice is to prepare students for citizenship in the modern world by giving them a better knowledge and understanding of their social, cultural, economic, and physical environment. In this regard the Department endeavors to teach critical thinking to broaden the student's social background for entry into various vocations, and to provide the background for entrance into professional and graduate schools. MAJOR IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Anyone interested in Criminal Justice who is eligible for admission to the University may be awarded a degree by completing the following requirements:

- An Associate of Arts degree in Criminal Justice may be earned upon the successful completion of the 68-71 semester hours as outlined in the Two-Year Curriculum in Criminal Justice.
- A Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminal Justice may be earned upon the successful completion of 36 semester hours in Criminal Justice. Eighteen of these major hours must be earned at Southeastern Louisiana University, and a total of 120-123 hours as outlined in the four-year curriculum in Criminal Justice.
