



## **Graduating Class Profile Academic Year 2014-2015**

### **Executive Summary**

Each summer, the Office of Institutional Research prepares the Graduating Class Profile Report. This year's report contains information on the 2014-2015 academic year graduates. Basic demographics are included as well as information on how long the graduates have attended Southeastern and from which institutions students last transferred.

During the 2014-2015 academic year, Southeastern conferred a total of 2,319 degrees, a decrease of 106 (4.4%) degrees from the 2013-2014 academic year. Seventy-four percent (74%) of baccalaureate degree recipients are White, Non-Hispanic, while sixty-two percent (62%) are female.

Some highlights include:

- Twenty-three percent (23%) of the graduates who were classified as Beginning Freshmen graduated within four years. This is the same rate as 2013-2014 graduating class.
- For transfer students, Southeastern's leading feeder school is Baton Rouge Community College followed by Delgado Community College, Louisiana State University – Baton Rouge, River Parishes Community College, University of New Orleans, University of Louisiana-Lafayette, Nunez Community College, Southern University-Baton Rouge, and Our Lady of The Lake College.
- The undergraduate baccalaureate program with the highest number of graduates in 2014-2015 is the B.G.S. in General Studies. This program is followed by the B.S. in Nursing, B.A. in Management, B.A. Psychology, and B.S. in Accounting.
- The baccalaureate programs (at least 5 graduates) with the highest percentage of students who began as transfers are B.G.S. General Studies, followed by B.S. Supply Chain Management, B.A. English Education, B.A. Social Studies Education, B.A. Business Administration, B.A. Social Work, B.S. Finance, B.S. Nursing, B. S. Health & Physical Education K-12. B.A. Sociology, B.S. Middle School Education, B.A. Spanish, B.S. Accounting, and B.S. Elementary Education. In contrast, the programs with the lowest percentage of transfers are B.M. Music, B.S. Industrial Technology, B.S. Engineering Technology, B.A. Spanish, B.S. Biological Sciences, and B. A. Communications.
- Sixty-seven percent (67%) of the baccalaureate degree recipients started Southeastern as Beginning Freshmen. This is down only one percentage point over last year.
