- » **Mr. Todd Delaney (College of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences-KSLU)** - “Radio Community Service Grant” Mr. Delaney received \$85,876.00 from the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB) to support the growth and development of KSLU public radio station. CPB funds a variety of public radio and news media services by distributing the funds directly to qualifying public radio stations through the Community Services Grants (CSG) program to support general station operations and national programming production and acquisition.
- » **Dr. Cynthia Elliot (Department of Teaching and Learning)** – “Gates Foundation: Southern Teacher Prep Transformation Center” Dr. Elliot was awarded \$175,000.00 from Texas Tech University through the Gates Foundation to facilitate collaboration among partner districts, providers and key stakeholders for the purpose of creating class-room ready teachers and advancing learning and innovation in teacher preparation through technical support, design based research and transparent use of data.
- » **Ms. Linda Isaac (Department of Health & Human Sciences)** – “Ms. Isaac was awarded \$127,431 for the Independent Living Skills Project. The program supports the Louisiana Department of Children and Family Services (DVSF) and Office of Juvenile Justice (OJJ) in providing independent living skills training youth 14-21 years of age. This project assists youth in the transition to self-sufficiency; provide education, training and services necessary to obtain employment; prepare them for entry into postsecondary training and educational institutions; and provide opportunities for personal and emotional growth and support.
- » **Dr. Hye-Young Kim (Department of Chemistry & Physics)** – “Large Scale Atomistic Simulation for Novel Self-Assembled Drug Delivery Vehicles.” Dr. Kim was awarded \$184,061.00 from the Louisiana State University, Louisiana Biomedical Network program to conduct research in the area of computational biophysics, emphasizing the fundamental and applied aspects of the development of novel self-assembled drug delivery vehicles.
- » **Mr. William Joubert (Small Business Development Center)** - “Small Business Development Center Program 2015-16.” Mr. Joubert was awarded \$220,000.00 from the University of Louisiana at Monroe for the delivery of management and technical assistance to small businesses in Louisiana.
- » **Ms. June Taylor (TRIO: Student Support Services)** – “Student Support Services (SSS)” Ms. Taylor was awarded \$1,684,250.00 from the U.S. Department of Education. SSS provides tutoring, mentoring, academic, career, financial aid, and graduate school counseling, cultural events, and workshops. The services enhance participants’ academic, career and personal development skills and are designed to prepare participants for a successful college career as well as for the working world after graduation.
