



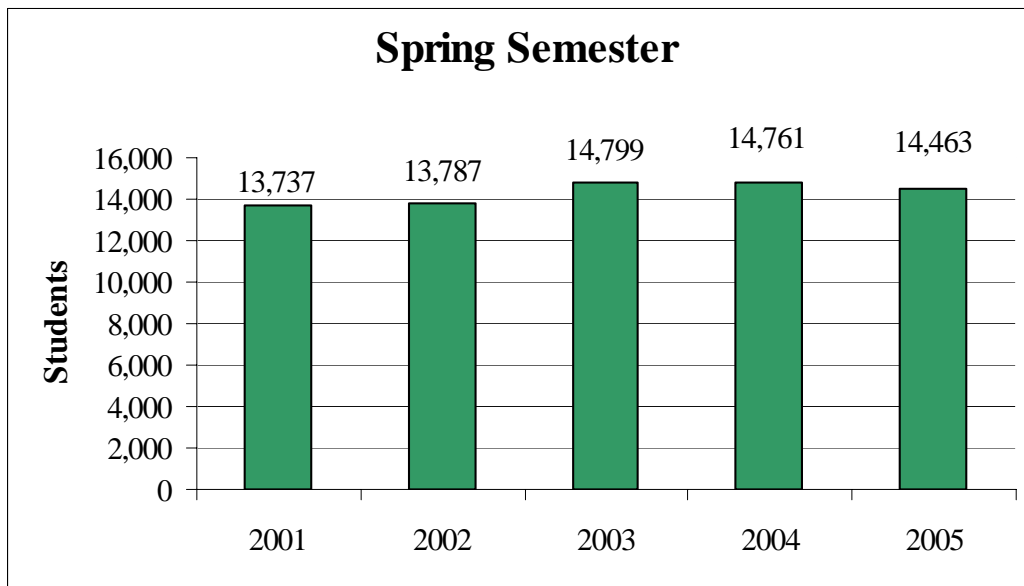

### Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 2.0% from the Spring 2004 semester to the Spring 2005 semester. This reflects no increase or decrease in undergraduate enrollment and a 14.0% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



## Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students increased slightly to 18.4% of total enrollment compared to 18.2% in Spring 2004.

## Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 13.3 hours which is the same as Spring 2004. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 5.9 hours, which a slight increase from 5.8 in Spring 2004.

## Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score increased from 18.7 in Spring 2004 to 20.5 in Spring 2005.

## Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught decreased 0.7% from the Spring 2004 semester to the Spring 2005 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

## Top Six Parishes

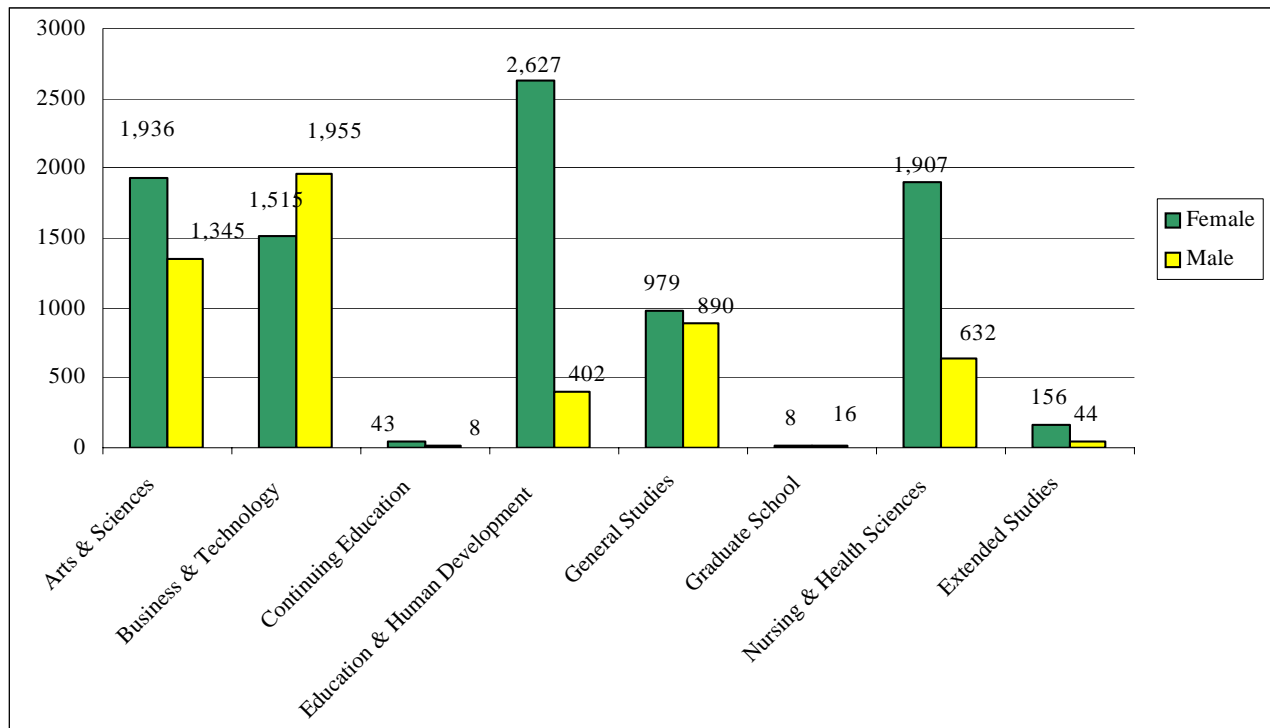

East Baton Rouge had the largest percent increase in graduate students with an increase of 8 students or 3%.
