



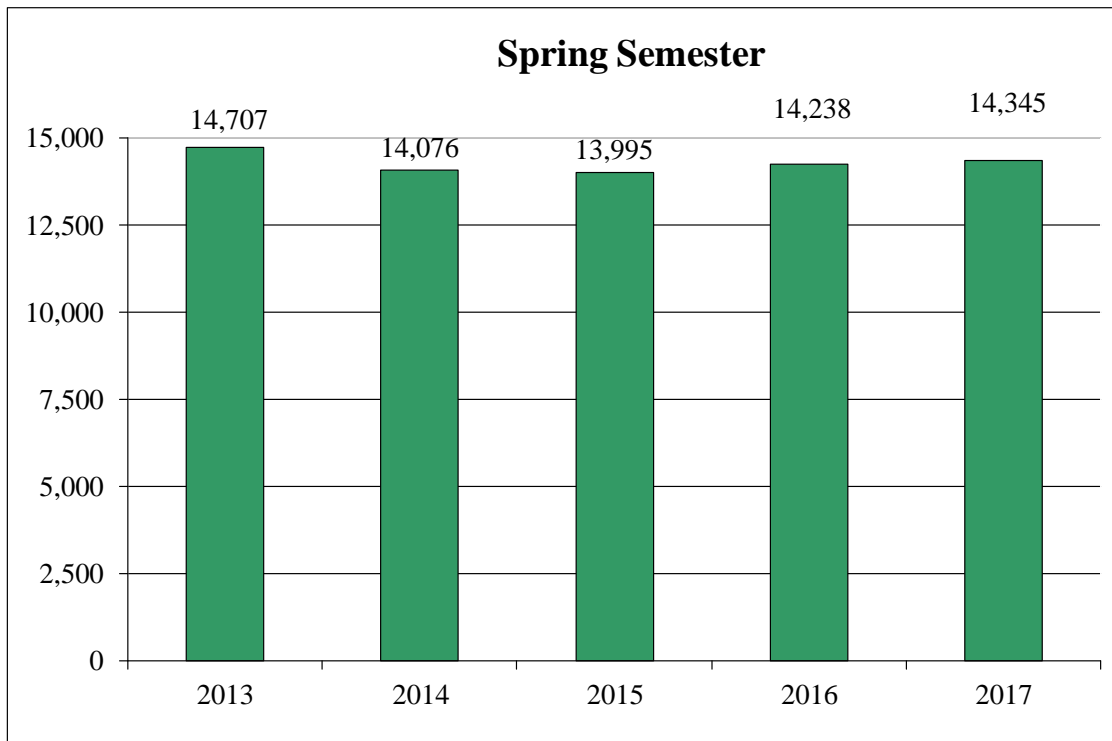

Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment increased by 0.8% from the Spring 2016 semester to the Spring 2017 semester. This reflects a increase of 1.1% in undergraduate enrollment and a 4.6% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students remained at 29.8% of total enrollment, the same as Spring 2016.

The average course load of undergraduate students is 10.9 hours which is a slight decrease from 11.1 in Spring 2016. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 6.9 hours, which is a slight increase from 6.9 in Spring 2016.

The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

Top Six Parishes

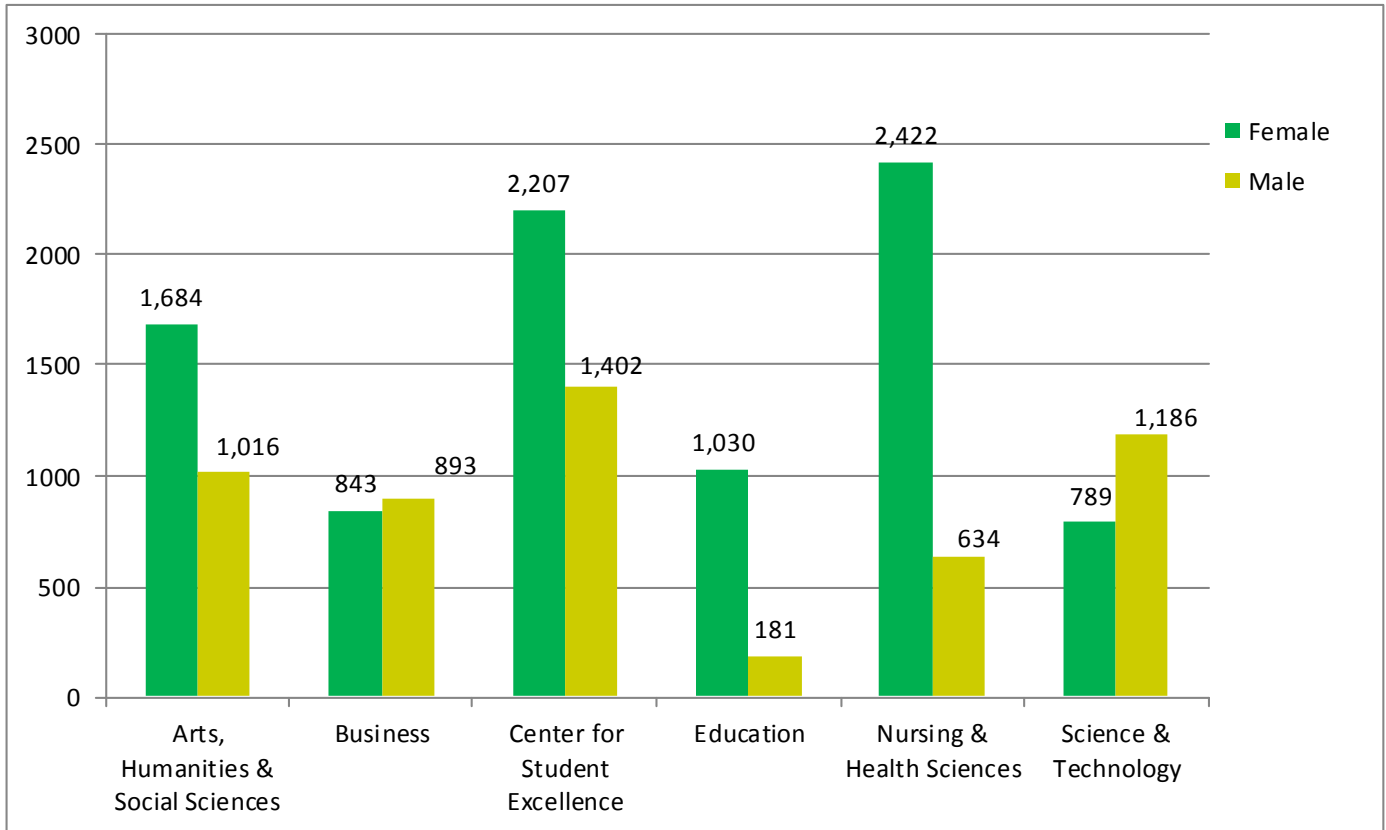
