



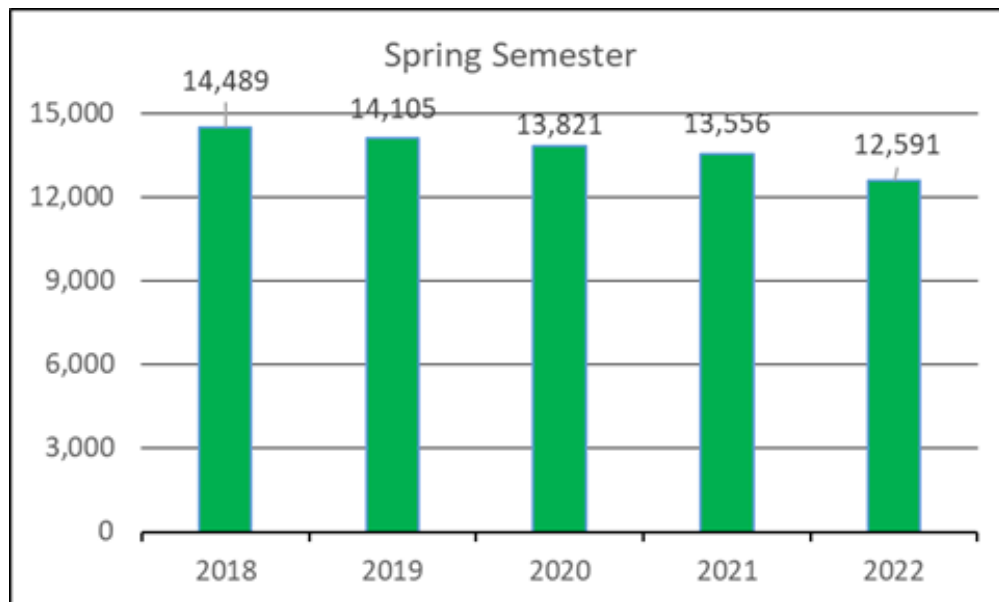
# *Semester Registration Report*

## *Spring 2022*

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### Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 7.1% from the Spring 2021 semester to the Spring 2022 semester. This reflects a decrease of 7.8% in undergraduate enrollment and a 1.5% increase in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



## Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students decreased to 28.2% of total enrollment compared to 30.9% in Spring 2021.

## Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 11.4 hours which is the same as Spring 2021. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 6.9 hours, which is a slight decrease from 7.0 in Spring 2021.

(Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

## Top Six Parishes

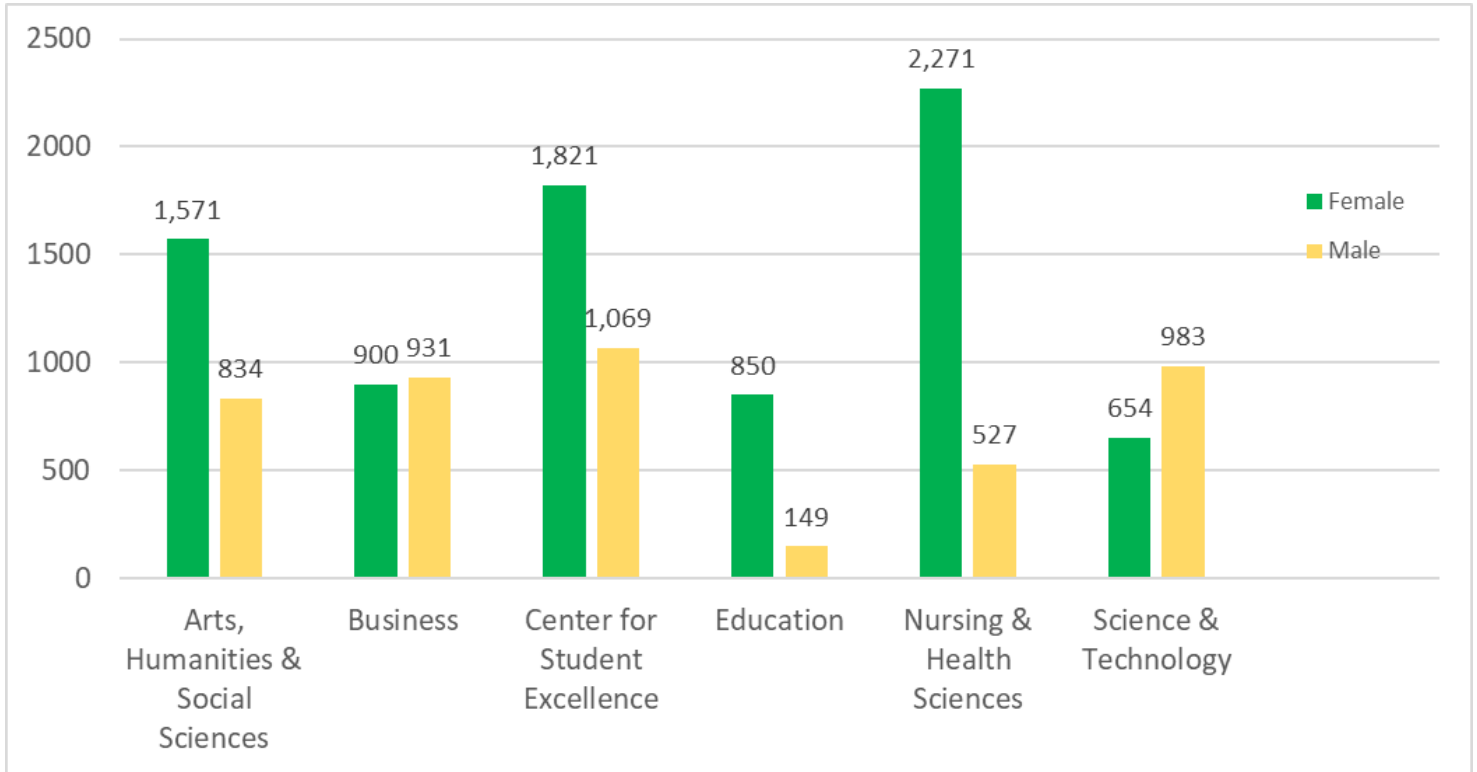
