



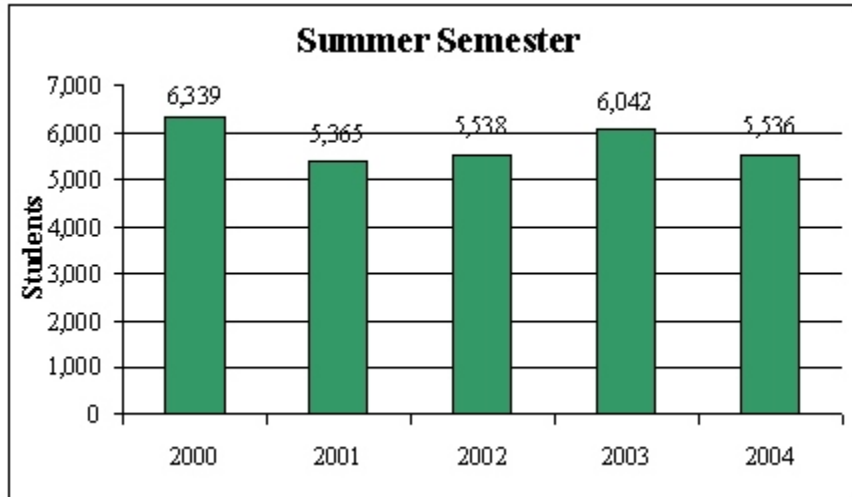
Semester Registration Report

Summer 2004

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Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 8.4% from the Summer 2003 semester to the Summer 2004 semester. This reflects a 7.2% decrease in undergraduate enrollment and a 12.2% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students remained relatively steady at 21.4% in Summer 2004 compared to 21.7% in Summer 2003.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 5.6 hours which the same as Summer 2003. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 4.8 hours, which a slight decrease from 5.0 in Summer 2003. In Summer, a full-time undergraduate student is enrolled in 6 or more hours and full-time graduate students in 4 or more hours. Part-time undergraduate students are enrolled in less than 6 hours and graduate students in less than 4 hours.

Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught decreased 10.7% from the Summer 2003 semester to the Summer 2004 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 6, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 4.

Top Six Parishes

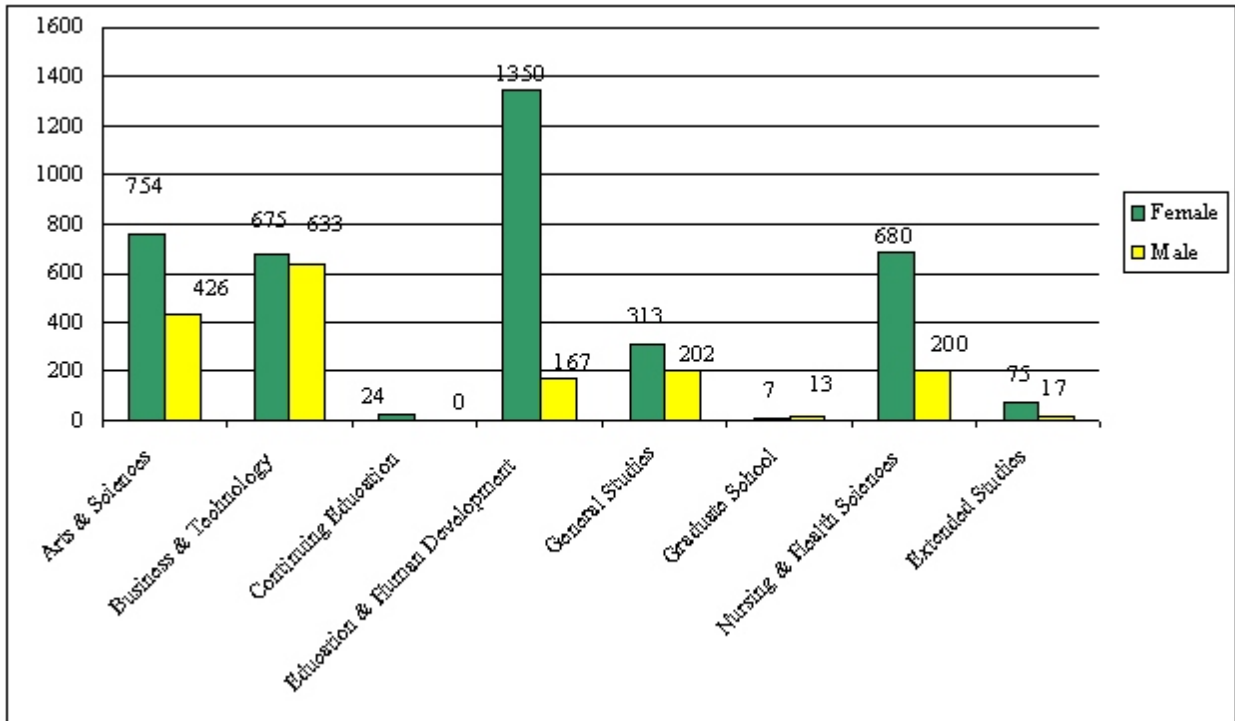

With 1,429 students, Tangipahoa is the most represented parish. Compared to Summer 2003, Jefferson Parish stayed the same in undergraduate enrollment with 207 students. Tangipahoa had the smallest percent decrease in graduate students with a decrease of 2 students or 0.8%.
