



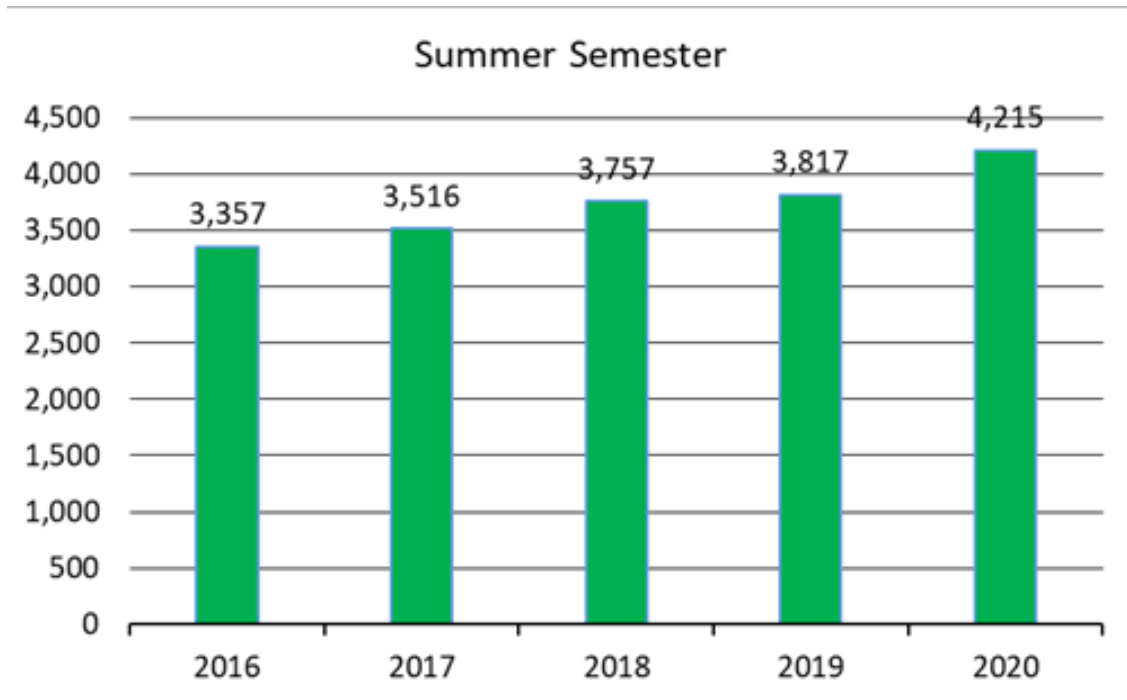
# *Semester Registration Report*

## *Summer 2020*

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### Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment increased by 10.4% from the Summer 2019 semester to the Summer 2020 semester. This reflects a 12.3% increase in undergraduate enrollment and a 1.3% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



## Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students increased to 33.9% of total enrollment compared to 31.6% in Summer 2019.

## Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 5.7 hours, which is slightly higher than Summer 2019's 5.4 average. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 5.0 hours, which is the same as Summer 2019. In Summer, a full-time undergraduate student is enrolled in 6 or more hours and full-time graduate students in 4 or more hours. Part-time undergraduate students are enrolled in less than 6 hours and graduate students in less than 4 hours.

## Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score increased from 23.0 in Summer 2019 to 22.9 in Summer 2020.

## Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught increased 14.7% from the Summer 2019 semester to the Summer 2020 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 6, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 4.

## Top Six Parishes

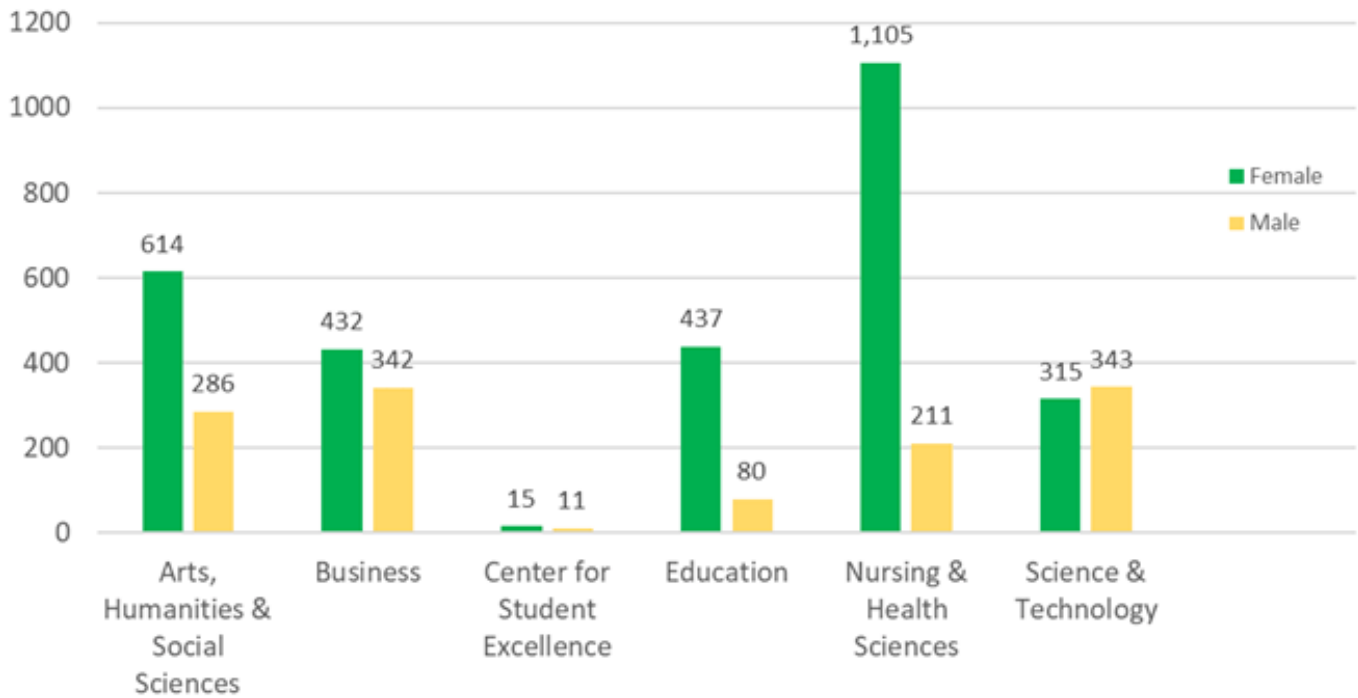
