arsh morning glory is a perennial climbing vine found in fresh to brackish marshes. A common plant, it forms dense mats over other vegetation. Marsh morning glory gets its species name from the arrow-shaped leaves that distinguish it from the other Morning glories. Its flowers are large, lavender and funnel-shaped. Ducks and other birds eat the seeds of this colorful, highly noticeable vine.
