



HIGH SCHOOL SPECIAL ADMISSION PROGRAM

Southeastern Scholars Program students with fewer than 18 hours earned:

- Gives students the opportunity to earn college credit while in high school.
- Provides tuition assistance for up to 6 hours per semester.
- Students can enter the program as early as their freshman year of high school.

Requirements

- 3.0 or higher cumulative high school GPA
- 24 or higher composite ACT score
- Approval of high school principal

Important Notes

- Students applying for this special program must complete both the application for admission and the specific program form. In addition, they must turn in the appropriate application fee, immunization records, and ACT scores.
- Students in this program DO NOT have to reapply for admission to become a beginning freshman unless they have not attended classes for one full year.
- Although the Southeastern Scholars Program does provide a tuition waiver, it does not cover the full cost of taking the courses. Students are responsible for paying any fees not covered by the waiver.

University Testing Options

TESTING

COLLEGE LEVEL EXAMINATION PROGRAM SUBJECT EXAMINATIONS (CLEP)

Cost: \$93, plus institutional fee of \$25. Fees should be paid at the time of testing, and are payable through credit card, check or money order made payable to CLEP.

An enrolled or entering student at Southeastern may gain credit in a number of courses by completing certain subject examinations of the College Level Examination Program (CLEP) provided by Educational Testing Services and administered through the Testing Office. CLEP examinations may be taken at Southeastern by appointment only. All tests are computer based, which allows for immediate test result(s) upon completion of testing.

Credit will be entered on a student's transcript upon receipt of an official score from ETS, provided the student achieves at or above the level score accepted by Southeastern. A grade of P will be given, and the course will not be computed in the student's average. Unsuccessful attempts shall not be recorded against the student.

Southeastern will accept a maximum of 30 semester hours credit through CLEP and a maximum of 60 semester hours through all types of nontraditional educational experiences, i.e., Advance Placement Credit, Correspondence Courses, and Military Service credits (DANTES).

CREDITS THROUGH THE DANTES SUBJECT STANDARDIZED TEST

DANTES Exams—Cost: \$100, plus institutional fee of \$25. Fees should be paid at the time of testing and are payable by credit card.

Under an agreement between the Chauncey Group International, a subsidiary of Educational Testing Services (ETS), and the U. S. Department of Defense, Southeastern is allowed to administer the DANTES Subject Standardized Tests (DSSTs). DANTES tests may be taken in the testing office at Southeastern by appointment only. Credit will be entered on a student's transcript upon receipt of an official transcript from the Chauncey Group, provided the student achieves at or above the score accepted by Southeastern. A grade of P will be given, and the course will not be computed in the student's average. Unsuccessful attempts will not be recorded against the student.

SOUTHEASTERN LOUISIANA UNIVERSITY DEPARTMENTAL CREDIT EXAMINATIONS

Departmental Exams-Cost: \$25 per exam

Southeastern departmental credit examinations are administered in the summer, fall, and spring to Southeastern students and to entering students.

- A student interested in taking departmental credit examinations may obtain the request forms at the academic department.
- A student will have the request form approved by his/ her department head, the dean of his/her college, and the head of the department administering the examination.
- 3. The University charges a non-refundable fee of \$25 per credit examination.
- 4. Credit examinations are given on the undergraduate level and on a limited basis in certain graduate degree programs.
- Only courses passed will be recorded on the student's record. A grade of P will be given, and the course will not be computed in the student's grade point average.
- 6. Credit earned through departmental credit examinations will be limited to 24 semester hours. Credit earned through all types of nontraditional educational experiences, i.e., advanced standing credit, extension courses, correspondence-study courses, and military service credits will be limited to 60 semester hours.
- 7. The department head in which the course is offered will set the dates of tests at his/her discretion.

ACCUPLACER

ACCUPLACER is a computer-based test designed to test an individual's knowledge of subject areas. There are two subject areas: Math and English. The institution fee for this exam is \$10 per test and must be paid prior to scheduling an appointment.

ALEKS

ALEKS Placement, Preparation and Learning Assessment determines readiness for mathematics courses. ALEKS PPL is a web-based program that uses artificial intelligence to map a student's strengths and weaknesses. What is the purpose of placement testing? The placement Assessment results will be used to determine the most appropriate courses for each student as they move forward with college coursework. After taking a Placement Assessment, students should meet with their advisor to review their results and enroll in the best classes based on their scores.

CREDIT THROUGH THE COLLEGE BOARD ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

Southeastern participates in the College Board Advanced Placement Program. Students in selected high schools take college-level courses in high school, and their examinations are graded by the staff of the College Board. The accompanying list shows the Advanced Placement Courses, the required scores, and the equivalent Southeastern courses for which credit will be given at Southeastern.

SOUTHEASTERN ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Advanced Placement is offered in the departments of English, Foreign Languages and Literatures, Kinesiology and Health Studies, and Mathematics in some courses. Credit will be granted in these courses after students have successfully completed the designated higher-level course. See department head for detailed information.

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE CREDIT

Southeastern values the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme and welcomes applications from IB students. The IB Diploma Programme is a comprehensive two-year curriculum leading to examinations evaluated on international criteria. Students are encouraged to submit their IB diploma record or examination results with their application for evaluation.

- For students completing IB coursework, a maximum of 30 credit hours may be awarded for scores of 5 or above on standard level or 4 and above on higher level examinations (See table below.) Students with IB examinations in a subject area not listed should contact the appropriate department head for potential evaluation.
- · The official International Baccalaureate transcript is required to award credit.



DUAL ENROLLMENT 15+ COMPLETION AWARD

Students who complete I5 or more Southeastern dual enrollment credit hours can also receive a \$1,000 (\$500 Fall; \$500 Spring) supplementary award for their first year at Southeastern. This is contingent upon the availability of funds and upon meeting the following criteria:

- Completion of a minimum of 15 Southeastern dual enrollment credits with a grade of "C" or better.
- Full-time enrollment at Southeastern for the first Fall semester following their high school graduation.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Attending Southeastern can be a very rewarding experience for high achieving students. It can also be a great value. Southeastern's aggressive scholarships are also guaranteed. Southeastern's competitive scholarship structure provides guaranteed funds to those who qualify.

Honors Scholarships

Southeastern's Honors Scholarships are granted automatically to incoming freshmen who qualify. Combined with The Southeastern Promise, these scholarships provide students a fixed rate tuition that is affordable and predictable.

Southeastern's deadline for priority scholarships are as follows:

- Student's admitted for Summer/Fall: January 15
- Student's admitted for Spring: September 15

TOPS

TOPS is a comprehensive program of state scholarships for students from the State of Louisiana and is awarded by the Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance (LOSFA). TOPS has four award levels with different selection criteria and retention requirements. Please note: TOPS can only be used within one year of high school graduation.

Foundation Scholarships

Southeastern also has over 300 privately-funded, donor-based scholarships available. These scholarships are made possible by generous alumni and friends of Southeastern, who have donated to allow students to focus on their studies more, to boost their academic success, and to help them graduate within four or five years. Students interested in Foundation Scholarships are encouraged to reach out to the department and/or college of their major, as well as refer to the Southeastern Scholarships website.

The Southeastern **Promise**

A Guaranteed Path to Four-Year Graduation at a fixed tuition rate

The Southeastern Promise represents a new level of commitment to each of our students and their ability to succeed. Through this ground-breaking program — the only one of its kind in Louisiana — Southeastern promises its students no tuition increases and guarantees class availability to ensure their degree completion in four years. This, combined with awarded scholarships, gives security in financial and academic planning.

Tenets of The Southeastern Promise:

- Southeastern will offer new freshmen the opportunity to enroll in The Southeastern Promise program.
- Southeastern will provide counseling, if desired, to help the student select a major no later than the first day of class for his or her third semester.
- With a declared major in place, Southeastern will guide the student with a prescribed curriculum and offer ongoing assistance from an assigned academic advisor.
- 4. To stay on track for graduation in four years and maintain program participation, 30 credit hours toward the selected degree program will be earned (Fall, Spring, Summer) each year.
- 5. Good academic standing and a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average are necessary for the four-year duration.
- Southeastern commits to providing availability of curriculum classes to ensure appropriate progress and enable degree attainment within four years.
- If an additional semester is required due to appropriate courses not being offered, Southeastern will cover the applicable tuition and mandatory fees for the student to complete the degree.

Fixed Net Tuition

Participating students will receive a fixed net tuition rate through four consecutive academic years beginning with the student's first freshman semester with eligibility remaining in effect through summer of their fourth year. Continued receipt of this benefit is contingent upon uninterrupted student eligibility and plan participation.

The guaranteed rate includes all mandatory tuition and fees associated with enrollment with the exception of student self-assessed and other variable fees. In the event of any tuition rate increases, students in the program become recipients of a scholarship that will credit the amount of the increase.

Four-Year to Degree Commitment

The four-year graduation component of The Southeastern Promise has been developed to help students pursue clear paths for completing their undergraduate degree in a timely manner. Graduation within four academic years of initial fall enrollment at Southeastern is ensured, conditioned upon the satisfaction of student eligibility requirements.

Southeastern will provide students with appropriate academic mapping, advising, and counseling to ensure curriculum progress. Academic units will ensure course availability accordingly. If a student maintains enrollment and follows the academic plan, yet is not able to complete the program in the prescribed four-year timeline due to course unavailability, Southeastern will coordinate a combination of equivalent class substitutions and will cover the applicable tuition and mandatory fees for the student to complete the degree.

How to Sign Up

After reading the detailed components of The Southeastern Promise program, students who have completed orientation and are eligible should be prepared to choose an approved major. Eligible students may then sign up to be a part of the program. southeastern.edu/promise

LOANS

Loans are a major source of financial aid for many students. All loans must be repaid. There are several types of loans with different terms, conditions, interest rates, and requirements. Southeastern offers the following education loan options:

Federal Direct Stafford Loans

Including both subsidized and unsubsidized loans, these are education loans in the student's name and are applied for through the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

Federal Perkins Loans

The Federal Perkins Loan provides a low-interest loan option for upperclass students with demonstrated financial need. Availability of the Federal Perkins Loan is often limited and awarded on a first-come, first-served basis.

Federal PLUS Loans

The Federal Parent PLUS Loan enables parents of dependent undergraduate students with good credit history the opportunity to borrow additional money to cover education expenses. The parent applying for the PLUS loan must be listed on the student's FAFSA. To apply for a Parent PLUS Loan, the parent must log-in with his/her Social Security Number and FAFSA pin.

The Federal Graduate PLUS Loan enables graduate students with good credit history the opportunity to borrow additional money beyond the Federal Direct Stafford Loan to cover education expenses.

FEDERAL AND STATE GRANT PROGRAMS

The Federal and State Grant Programs offered by Southeastern include the Federal Pell Grant, the Federal Supplemental Education Opportunity Grant (SEOG), the Federal Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education Grant (TEACH), and the Louisiana GO Grant.

The FAFSA is the application for these grant programs. These grants are need-based aid programs that do not need to be repaid.

Federal Pell Grant

The Federal Pell Grant Program provides need-based awards to undergraduate students only. Eligibility is determined by the Expected Family Contribution (EFC), the cost of attendance, and the student's enrollment status.

Federal SEOG Grant

The Federal Supplemental Education Opportunity Grant (SEOG) is a grant for undergraduate students with exceptional financial need. Eligibility is determined by the Expected Family Contribution (EFC), the cost of attendance, and the student's enrollment status. Funding for the Federal SEOG Grant is limited.

Federal Work Study

The Federal Work-Study (FWS) Program provides part-time, on-campus and off-campus (community service based) employment, to students with financial need. This award, usually made to students in combination with other forms of financial aid, allows them to help meet their educational expenses without incurring more debt. The program is also intended to broaden the range of job opportunities for qualified students. Louisiana GO Grant

The Louisiana GO Grant is a state-funded grant available to undergraduate students who demonstrate financial need. To receive this grant a student must be a Louisiana resident and meet the criteria as set forth by the Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance. Funding for the Louisiana GO Grant is limited.




