

Graduating Class Profile 2017-2018

Executive Summary

Each summer, the Office of Institutional Research prepares the Graduating Class Profile Report. This year's report contains information on the 2017-2018 graduates. Basic demographics are included as well as information on how long the graduates have attended Southeastern and from which institutions students last transferred.

During the 2017-2018 academic year Southeastern conferred a total of 2,128 degrees, an increase of 54 (2.6%) degrees from 2016-2017. Sixty-five percent (65%) of baccalaureate degree recipients are White, Non-Hispanic, while sixty-two percent (62%) are female.

Some highlights include:

- Twenty-six percent (26%) of the graduates classified as Beginning Freshmen graduated within four years. This is up three percentage points from the 2016-2017 graduating class.
- For transfer students, Southeastern's leading feeder school is Baton Rouge Community College followed by Delgado Community College, Louisiana State University Baton Rouge, River Parishes Community College, University of Louisiana-Lafayette, Northshore Technical Community College, University of Louisiana-Monroe, and Nicholls State University.
- The undergraduate baccalaureate program with the highest number of graduates in 2017-2018 is the B.G.S. General Studies. The B.S.N. Nursing, B.A. Management, B.S. Kinesiology, and B.A. Psychology follow with the number of graduates.
- The baccalaureate programs (at least 5 graduates) with the highest percentage of students who began as transfers are: B.S. Middle School Education & Special Education followed by B.S. Information Technology, B.S. Communication Sciences and Disorders, B.S.N. Nursing, B.A. Social Work, B.A. Marketing, B.S. Industrial Technology, B.G.S. General Studies, and B.S. Finance. In contrast, the programs with the lowest percentage of transfers are B.S. Health Systems Management, B.M. Music, B.S. Mathematics, B.A. English Education, B.S. Family & Consumer Sciences, B.S. Athletic Training, and B.A. History.
- Sixty-nine (69%) of the baccalaureate degree recipients started Southeastern as Beginning Freshmen. This is down three percentage points over last year.
