Goal Statement

Each graduate of the Master's degree program in school administration and supervision will have developed personal and professional competence, qualified for certification in the appropriate area, and acquired the ability to cope with the rigors of professional school work.

Intended Outcomes

Students completing the Master's degree in Administration will be able to communicate effectively and will possess an appropriate knowledge base in order to function in school work.

Assessment Criteria

Students will score 75% or better on the graduate comprehensive examination.

90% of the graduates will rate the components of the Master's degree program in school administration and supervision as satisfactory or better on a survey of graduates.

90% of the employers will rate the graduates of the Master's degree program in school administration and supervision as satisfactory or better on an employer survey.

Graduates will be able to demonstrate practical knowledge gained through classes and field experiences.

Students will successfully complete the practicum in supervision and administration.

Students will pass the administration-supervision section of the National Teachers Examination with a score of 620 or above.

Students will possess appropriate background knowledge and credits for certifying in their option of study.

All students will meet the state requirements for certifying in their area of study.
