


One-Year Retention Rates Southeastern vs. University of Louisiana System Average First-Time, Full-Time, Degree Seeking Freshman By Cohort Year



🗖 Southeastern 🗖 UL System Average


- Southeastern shows a growing trend in overall retention rates. Southeastern's growth in retention is consistent with the increasing retention rate for the University of Louisiana System schools.
- Southeastern's Fall 2001 Entering Freshmen Cohort was retained at a higher rate than the University of Louisiana System's Average.

One-Year Retention Rates Male and Female for Southeastern First-Time, Full-Time, Degree Seeking Freshman By Cohort Year



- The retentions rate for Southeastern's Females has shown a slight increase over the past five years. The retention rate for Southeastern's Males has shown a larger increase for the same five years.
- Females are consistently retained at a higher rate than males. This is true for all University of Louisiana System schools for all five cohort years.

One-Year Retention Rates Black, non-Hispanic and White, non-Hispanic for Southeastern First-Time, Full-Time, Degree Seeking Freshman By Cohort Year



- Southeastern's Black, non-Hispanic students are retained at a higher rate than White, non-Hispanics.
- Southeastern Louisiana University and Northwestern State University are the only two schools in the University of Louisiana System that retain Black, non-Hispanics at a higher rate than White, non-Hispanics.
