


# Semester Registration Report Fall 2004

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#### **Longitudinal Enrollment**

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 1.2% from the Fall 2003 semester to the Fall 2004 semester. This reflects a 0.3% increase in undergraduate enrollment and an 11.1% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



#### **Minority Enrollment**

The enrollment of minority students increased to 18.3% of total enrollment compared to 17.8% in Fall 2003.

### **Average Course Loads**

The average course load of undergraduate students is 13.3 hours which is a slight decrease from 13.4 in Fall 2003. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 5.9 hours, which a slight increase from 5.8 in Fall 2003.

#### **Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores**

The average ACT Composite score increased from 19.9 in Fall 2003 to 21.0 in Fall 2004.

#### Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught decreased 0.6% from the Fall 2003 semester to the Fall 2004 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

### **Top Six Parishes**



With 3,435 students, Tangipahoa is the most represented parish. Compared to Fall 2003, Jefferson Parish and Livingston Parish both showed an increase of 3% in undergraduate enrollment. Livingston had the smallest percent decrease in graduate students with a decrease of 12 students or 5%.
