


Semester Registration Report Fall 2006

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Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 5.9% from the Fall 2005 semester to the Fall 2006 semester. This reflects a 5.6% decrease in undergraduate enrollment and a 8.2% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students decreased slightly to 20.5% of total enrollment compared to 20.9% in Fall 2005.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 13.6 hours which is an increase from 13.1 in Fall 2005. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 6.1 hours, which a slight increase from 6.0 in Fall 2006.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score increased from 21.0 in Fall 2005 to 21.1 in Fall 2006.

Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught decreased 2.6% from the Fall 2005 semester to the Fall 2006 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

Top Six Parishes



With 3,165 students, St. Tammany is the most represented parish. Compared to Fall 2005, Jefferson Parish had the largest increase (5.5%) in undergraduate enrollment. East Baton Rouge had the largest percent increase in graduate students with an increase of 7 students or 2.7%.

The number of female students enrolled at Southeastern decreased by 5.8% from Fall 2005 to Fall 2006; male students decreased 6.1%. There were a total of 9,595 females students enrolled and 5,523 male students enrolled.
