


Semester Registration Report Fall 2009

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Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 0.4% from the Fall 2008 semester to the Fall 2009 semester. This reflects a 0.7% decrease in undergraduate enrollment and a 2.0% increase in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students increased to 21.0% of total enrollment compared to 20.6% in Fall 2008.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 13.1 hours which is an increase from 13.0 in Fall 2008. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 6.5 hours, which is the same as Fall 2008.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score increased from 21.4 in Fall 2008 to 21.7 in Fall 2009.

Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught increased 0.2% from the Fall 2008 semester to the Fall 2009 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

Top Six Parishes



With 3,322 students, St. Tammany is the most represented parish. Compared to Fall 2008, Ascension Parish had the largest increase (6.2%) in undergraduate enrollment. Ascension had the largest percent increase in graduate students with an increase of 35.1%.

The number of female students enrolled at Southeastern decreased by 1.0% from Fall 2008 to Fall 2009; male students increased 0.6%. There were a total of 9,513 females students enrolled and 5,647 male students enrolled.
