


Semester Registration Report Fall 2010

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Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment increased by 1.3% from the Fall 2009 semester to the Fall 2010 semester. This reflects a 1.2% increase in undergraduate enrollment and a 1.8% increase in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students increased to 22.1% of total enrollment compared to 21.0% in Fall 2009.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 12.8 hours which is an decrease from 13.1 in Fall 2009. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 6.4 hours, which is a decrease from 6.5 in Fall 2009.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score increased from 21.7 in Fall 2009 to 22.1 in Fall 2010.

Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught decreased 1.0% from the Fall 2009 semester to the Fall 2010 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

Top Six Parishes



The number of female students enrolled at Southeastern increased by 0.4% from Fall 2009 to Fall 2010; male students increased 2.7%. There were a total of 9,552 females students enrolled and 5,799 male students enrolled.
