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## Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 4.2\% from the Fall 2012 semester to the Fall 2013 semester. This reflects a $3.5 \%$ decrease in undergraduate enrollment and a $11.5 \%$ decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.


Minority Enrollment
The enrollment of minority students increased to $27.3 \%$ of total enrollment compared to $26.7 \%$ in Fall 2012.

## Average Course Loads

The average age of undergraduate students enrolled at Southeastern in Fall 2013 is 21.3, and the average age of graduate students is 32.0. On average, first-time, full-time degree-seeking freshmen beginning in Fall 2013 are 18.2 years old.
