



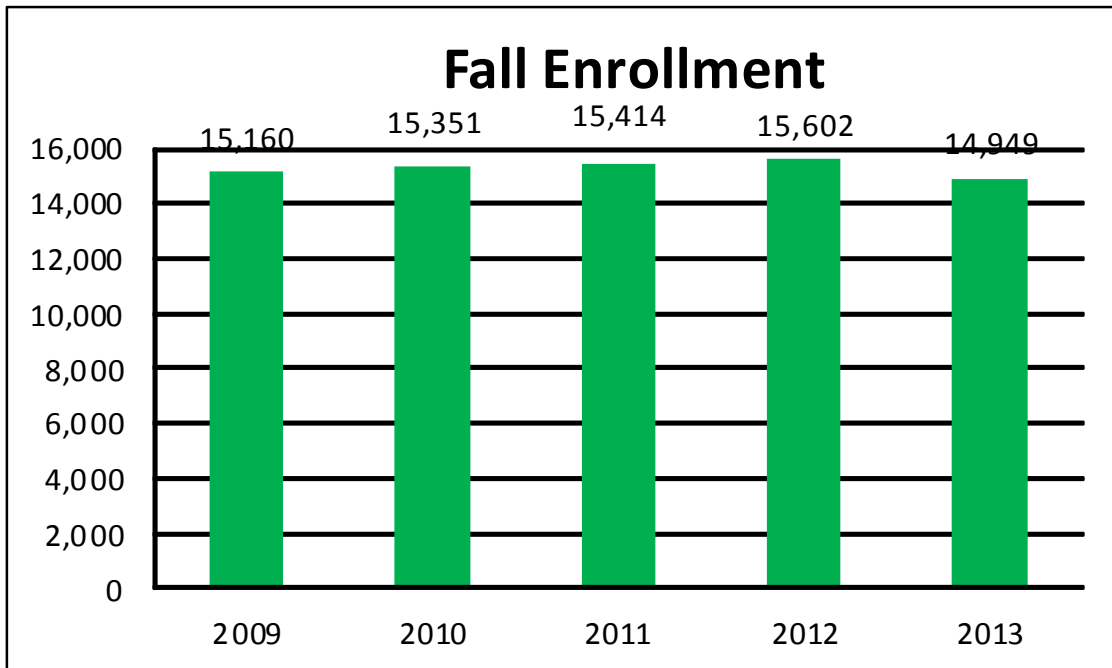
# *Semester Registration Report*

## *Fall 2013*

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### Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 4.2% from the Fall 2012 semester to the Fall 2013 semester. This reflects a 3.5% decrease in undergraduate enrollment and a 11.5% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



## Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students increased to 27.3% of total enrollment compared to 26.7% in Fall 2012.

## Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 12.1 hours which is the same as Fall 2012. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 6.5 hours, which is a decrease from 6.6 in Fall 2012.

## Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score decreased slightly from 22.1 in Fall 2012 to 22.0 in Fall 2013.

## Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught increased 0.7% from the Fall 2011 semester to the Fall 2012 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

## Top Six Parishes

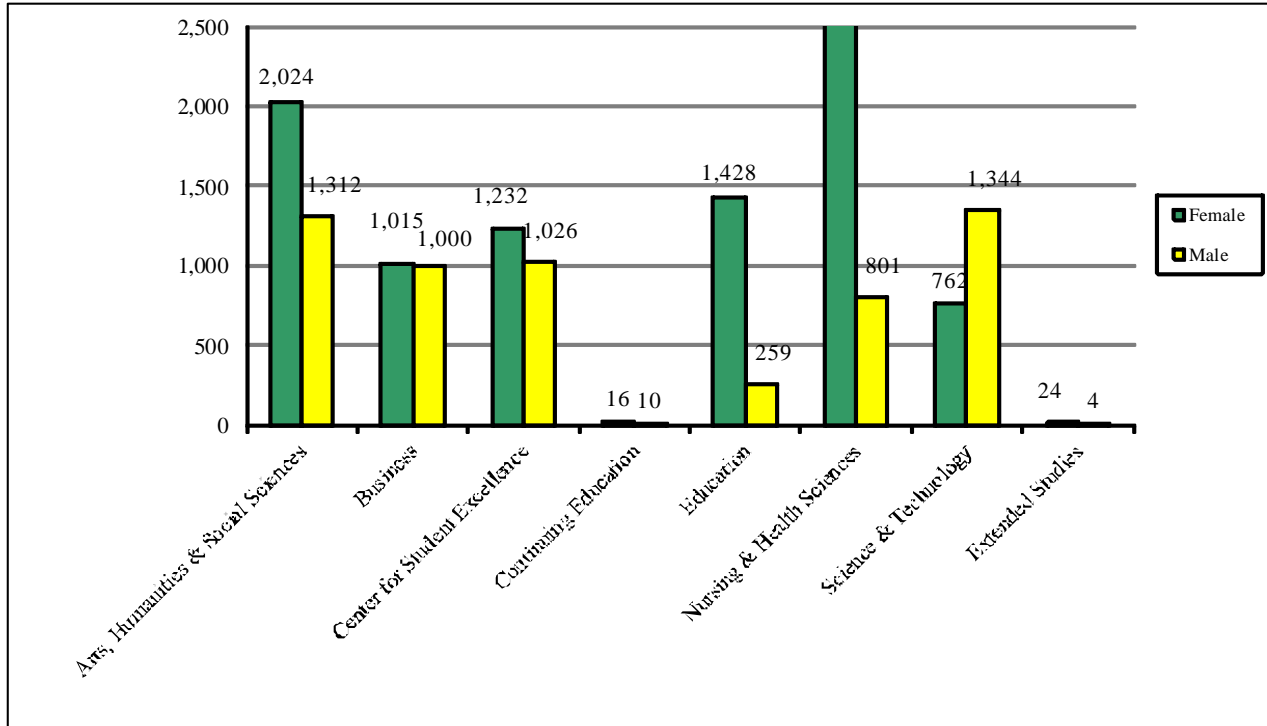

## Student Age
