

#### **Longitudinal Enrollment**

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 3.0% from the Fall 2013 semester to the Fall 2014 semester. This reflects a 2.7% decrease in undergraduate enrollment and a 6.9% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



#### **Minority Enrollment**

The enrollment of minority students increased to 28.7% of total enrollment compared to 27.3% in Fall 2013.

#### **Average Course Loads**

The average course load of undergraduate students is 11.9 hours which is a decrease from 12.1 in Fall 2013. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 6.7 hours, which is an increase from 6.5 in Fall 2013.

#### **Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores**

The average ACT Composite score decreased slightly from 22.0 in Fall 2013 to 21.9 in Fall 2014.

#### Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught decreased 3.7% from the Fall 2013 semester to the Fall 2014 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

### **Top Six Parishes**



Jefferson had the smallest percent decrease in graduate students with a decrease of 2.9%.

The number of female students enrolled at Southeastern decreased by 2.0% from Fall 2013 to Fall 2014; male students decreased 4.7%. There were a total of 9,011 females students enrolled and 5,487 male students enrolled.
