



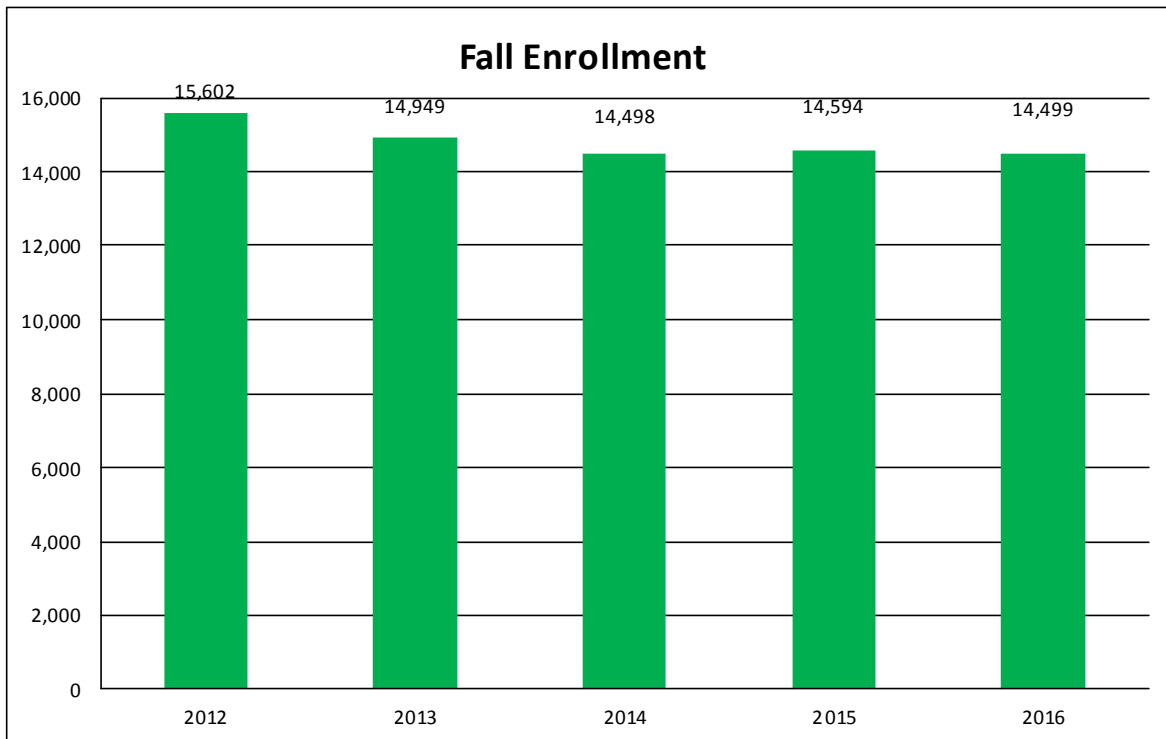
# *Semester Registration Report*

## *Fall 2016*

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### Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 0.7% from the Fall 2015 semester to the Fall 2016 semester. This reflects a 0.1% decrease in undergraduate enrollment and a 8.5% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



## Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students increased to 31.2% of total enrollment compared to 30.5% in Fall 2015.

## Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 11.4 hours which is a decrease from 11.6 in Fall 2015. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 7.1 hours, which is an increase from 6.9 in Fall 2015.

The average ACT Composite score remained the same from 21.9 in Fall 2014 to 21.9 in Fall 2015.

## Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught decreased 2.2% from the Fall 2015 semester to the Fall 2016 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

## Top Six Parishes

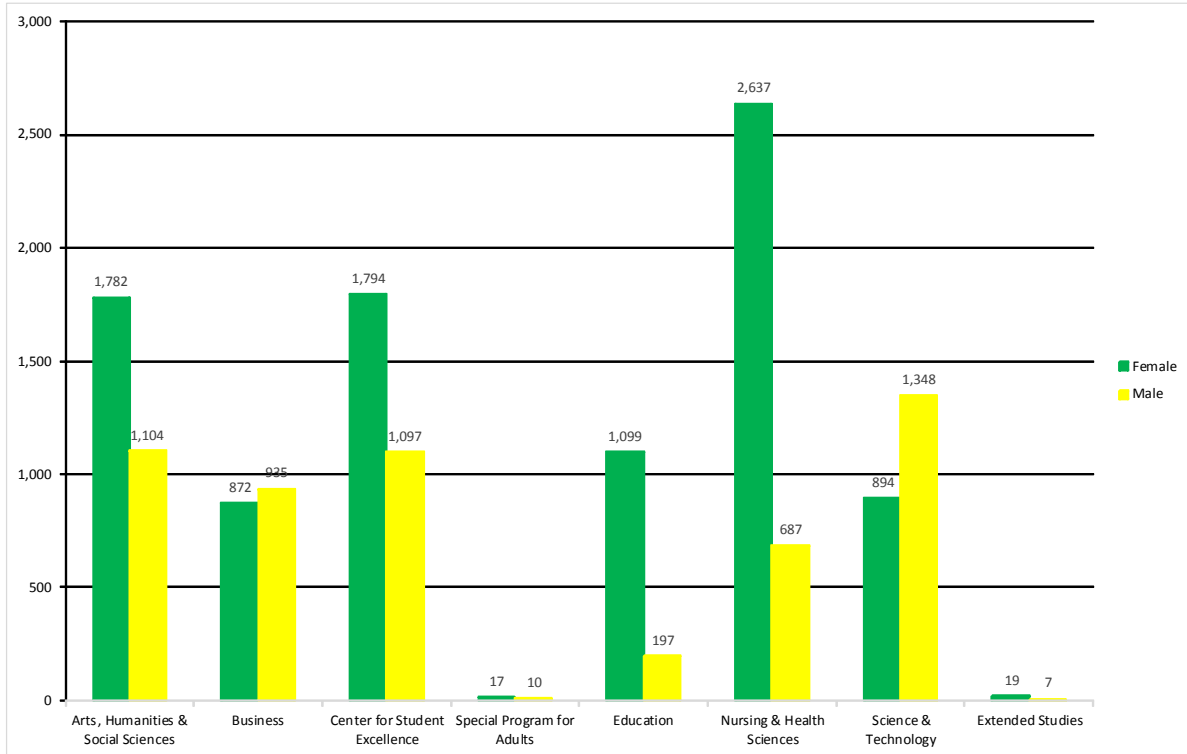

Jefferson also had the largest percent increase in graduate students with an increase of 8.3%.
