


Semester Registration Report Spring 2006

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Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 2.6% from the Spring 2005 semester to the Spring 2006 semester. This reflects a decrease of 0.9% in undergraduate enrollment and a 13.9% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.

The enrollment of minority students increased to 20.3% of total enrollment compared to 18.4% in Spring 2005.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 13.2 hours which a slight decrease from 13.3 in Spring 2005. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 6.0 hours, which a slight increase from 5.9 in Spring 2005.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score stayed the same as Spring 2005.

Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught decreased 1.8% from the Spring 2005 semester to the Spring 2006 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

Number of Hours Enrolled


Top Six Parishes

The six parishes which most of Southeastern's Louisiana resident students claim as a home parish are the parishes listed in the table below. With 3,361 students, St. Tammany is the most represented parish. Compared to Fall 2004, Jefferson Parish had the largest increase (17.8%) in undergraduate enrollment. Livingston had the largest percent increase in graduate students with an increase of 4 students or 6.9%.

The number of female students enrolled at Southeastern decreased by 2.4% from Spring 2005 to Spring 2006; male students decreased 2.9%. There were a total of 8,953 females students enrolled and 5,141 male students enrolled.
