


Semester Registration Report Spring 2007

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Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 3.5% from the Spring 2007 semester to the Spring 2007 semester. This reflects a decrease of 4.0% in undergraduate enrollment and a 0.2% increase in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students increased slightly to 20.4% of total enrollment compared to 20.3% in Spring 2006.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 13.6 hours which a slight increase from 13.2 in Spring 2006. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 6.1 hours, which a slight increase from 6.0 in Spring 2006.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score increased dramatically from 20.4 in Spring 2006 to 21.2 in Spring 2007.

Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught decreased 2.0% from the Spring 2006 semester to the Spring 2007 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

Top Six Parishes



With 2,875 students, St. Tammany is the most represented parish. Compared to Spring 2006, Jefferson Parish had the largest increase (17.0%) in undergraduate enrollment. St. Tammany had the largest percent increase in graduate students with an increase of 12.9%.

The number of female students enrolled at Southeastern decreased by 3.0% from Spring 2006 to Spring 2007; male students decreased 4.5%. There were a total of 8,685 females students enrolled and 4,911 male students enrolled.
