


Semester Registration Report Spring 2008

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Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 1.6% from the Spring 2007 semester to the Spring 2008 semester. This reflects a decrease of 0.4% in undergraduate enrollment and a 10.7% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students increased to 20.9% of total enrollment compared to 20.4% in Spring 2007.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 13.3 hours which a slight decrease from 13.6 in Spring 2007. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 6.4 hours, which a slight increase from 6.1 in Spring 2007.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score decreased from 21.2 in Spring 2007 to 20.4 in Spring 2008.

Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught decreased 2.4% from the Spring 2007 semester to the Spring 2008 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

Top Six Parishes



With 2,849 students, St. Tammany is the most represented parish. Compared to Spring 2007, Livingston Parish had the largest increase (11.7%) in undergraduate enrollment. St. Tammany had the largest percent increase in graduate students with an increase of 12.9%.

The number of female students enrolled at Southeastern decreased by 1.3% from Spring 2007 to Spring 2008; male students decreased 2.2%. There were a total of 8,575 females students enrolled and 4,804 male students enrolled.
