


Semester Registration Report Spring 2010

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Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment increased by 5.0% from the Spring 2009 semester to the Spring 2010 semester. This reflects an increase of 4.8% in undergraduate enrollment and a 6.6% increase in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students increased to 21.2% of total enrollment compared to 20.4% in Spring 2009.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 13.0 hours which a slight decrease from 13.2 in Spring 2009. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 6.4 hours, which a slight decrease from 6.6 in Spring 2009.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score increased from 20.6 in Spring 2009 to 21.2 in Spring 2010.

Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught increased 3.3% from the Spring 2009 semester to the Spring 2010 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

Top Six Parishes



With 3,174 students, St. Tammany is the most represented parish. Compared to Spring 2009, Ascension Parish had the largest increase (15.3%) in undergraduate enrollment. Ascension had the largest percent increase in graduate students with an increase of 22.9%.
