## Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment increased by 5.0\% from the Spring 2009 semester to the Spring 2010 semester. This reflects an increase of $4.8 \%$ in undergraduate enrollment and a $6.6 \%$ increase in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.


## Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students increased to $21.2 \%$ of total enrollment compared to $20.4 \%$ in Spring 2009.
