



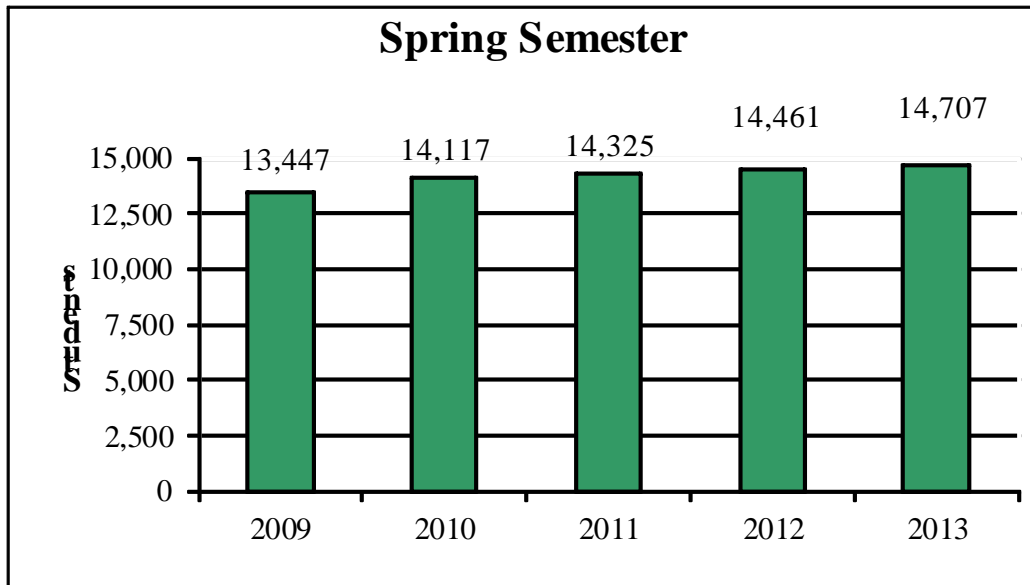
Semester Registration Report

Spring 2013

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Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment increased by 1.7% from the Spring 2012 semester to the Spring 2013 semester. This reflects an increase of 2.3% in undergraduate enrollment and a 4.5% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students increased to 26.5% of total enrollment compared to 23.5% in Spring 2012.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 11.8 hours which a decrease from 12.2 in Spring 2012. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 6.7 hours, which a slight increase from 6.6 in Spring 2012.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score increased from 20.8 in Spring 2011 to 21.7 in Spring 2012.

(Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

Top Six Parishes

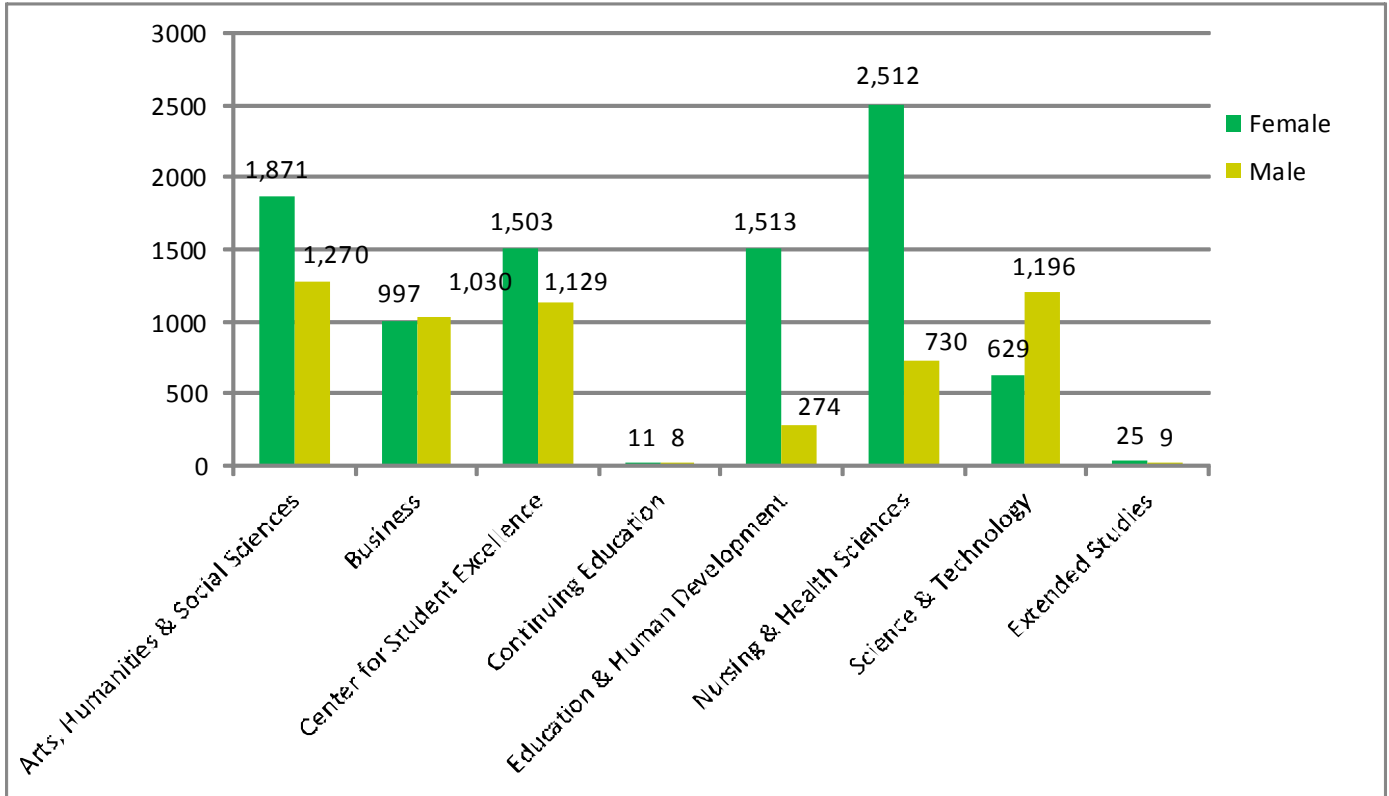
