


# Semester Registration Report Summer 2005

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#### **Longitudinal Enrollment**

Southeastern's total student enrollment increased by 1.1% from the Summer 2004 semester to the Summer 2005 semester. This reflects a 5.0% increase in undergraduate enrollment and a 12.2% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



#### **Minority Enrollment**

The enrollment of minority students remained relatively steady at 22.0% in Summer 2004 compared to 21.4% in Summer 2004.

#### **Average Course Loads**

The average course load of undergraduate students is 5.5 hours which is a slight decrease from 5.6 in Summer 2004. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 4.8 hours, which the same as Summer 2004. In Summer, a full-time undergraduate student is enrolled in 6 or more hours and full-time graduate students in 4 or more hours. Part-time undergraduate students are enrolled in less than 6 hours and graduate students in less than 4 hours.

#### Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught increased 0.9% from the Summer 2004 semester to the Summer 2005 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 6, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 4.

#### **Top Six Parishes**


The six parishes which most of Southeastern's Louisiana resident students claim as a home parish are the parishes listed in the table below. With 1,446 students, Tangipahoa is the most represented parish. Compared to Summer 2004, Washington Parish had the largest increase in undergraduate enrollment with an increase of 27.5% or 46 students. Livingston had the largest percent increase in graduate students with an increase of 9 students or 7.0%.
