


# Semester Registration Report Summer 2006

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#### **Longitudinal Enrollment**

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 6.7% from the Summer 2005 semester to the Summer 2006 semester. This reflects a 6.5% decrease in undergraduate enrollment and a 7.7% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



#### **Minority Enrollment**

The enrollment of minority students remained relatively steady at 22.2% in Summer 2006 compared to 22.0% in Summer 2005.

#### **Average Course Loads**

The average course load of undergraduate students is 5.6 hours which is a slight increase from 5.5 in Summer 2005. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 5.0 hours, which is an increase from 4.8 in Summer 2005. In Summer, a full-time undergraduate student is enrolled in 6 or more hours and full-time graduate students in 4 or more hours. Part-time undergraduate students are enrolled in less than 6 hours and graduate students in less than 4 hours.

#### **Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores**

The average ACT Composite score increased from 18.6 in Summer 2005 to 20.8 in Summer 2006.

#### Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught increased 4.9% from the Summer 2005 semester to the Summer 2006 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 6, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 4.

#### **Top Six Parishes**


The six parishes which most of Southeastern's Louisiana resident students claim as a home parish are the parishes listed in the table below. With 1,183 students, Tangipahoa is the most represented parish. Compared to Summer 2005, East Baton Rouge Parish had the largest increase in undergraduate enrollment with an increase of 15.2% or 30 students. Washington had the smallest percent decrease in graduate students with a decrease of 1 student or 2.5%.

The number of female students enrolled at Southeastern decreased by 5.7% from Summer 2005 to Summer 2006; male students decreased 8.7%. There were a total of 3,528 females students enrolled and 1,696 male students enrolled.
