


Semester Registration Report Summer 2008

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Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment increased by 5.6% from the Summer 2007 semester to the Summer 2008 semester. This reflects a 6.3% increase in undergraduate enrollment and a 2.3% increase in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students decreased very slightly to 22.6% of total enrollment compared to 22.8% in Summer 2007.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 5.5 hours which is a slight decrease from 5.6 in Summer 2007. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 4.8 hours, which is a decrease from 5.1 in Summer 2007. In Summer, a full-time undergraduate student is enrolled in 6 or more hours and full-time graduate students in 4 or more hours. Part-time undergraduate students are enrolled in less than 6 hours and graduate students in less than 4 hours.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score increased from 20.1 in Summer 2007 to 20.5 in Summer 2008.

Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught increased 2.8% from the Summer 2007 semester to the Summer 2008 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 6, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 4.

Top Six Parishes



The number of female students enrolled at Southeastern increased by 6.6% from Summer 2007 to Summer 2008; male students increased 3.4%. There were a total of 3,695 females students enrolled and 1,663 male students enrolled.
