


# Semester Registration Report Summer 2012

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#### **Longitudinal Enrollment**

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 10.3% from the Summer 2011 semester to the Summer 2012 semester. This reflects a 11.6% decrease in undergraduate enrollment and a 4.6% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



#### **Minority Enrollment**

The enrollment of minority students remained steady at 26.6% of total enrollment.

#### **Average Course Loads**

The average course load of undergraduate students is 5.5 hours which is a slight decrease from 5.6 in Summer 2011. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 5.1 hours, which is an increase from 4.9 in Summer 2011. In Summer, a full-time undergraduate student is enrolled in 6 or more hours and full-time graduate students in 4 or more hours. Part-time undergraduate students are enrolled in less than 6 hours and graduate students in less than 4 hours.

#### **Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores**

The average ACT Composite score remained the same at 21.3 in Summer 2011 and Summer 2012.

#### Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught decreased 10.3% from the Summer 2011 semester to the Summer 2012 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 6, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 4.

### **Top Six Parishes**



With 1,137 students, St. Tammany is the most represented parish. Compared to Summer 2011, Ascension Parish had the smallest decrease (-3.4%) in undergraduate enrollment. Livingston had the largest percent increase in graduate students with an increase of 28.1%.

The number of female students enrolled at Southeastern decreased by 11.9% from Summer 2011 to Summer 2012; male students decreased 7.2%. There were a total of 3,244 females students enrolled and 1,754 male students enrolled.
