


Semester Registration Report Summer 2015

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Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 11.5% from the Summer 2014 semester to the Summer 2015 semester. This reflects a 10.9% decrease in undergraduate enrollment and a 14.1% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students increased to 32.4% of total enrollment.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 5.4 hours, which is exactly the same as Summer 2014. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 4.9 hours, which is exactly the same as Summer 2014. In Summer, a full-time undergraduate student is enrolled in 6 or more hours and full-time graduate students in 4 or more hours. Part-time undergraduate students are enrolled in less than 6 hours and graduate students in less than 4 hours.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score increased from 21.3 in Summer 2014 to 22.6 in Summer 2015.

Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Students Taught

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught decreased 12.2% from the Summer 2014 semester to the Summer 2015 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 6, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 4.

Top Six Parishes



With 837 students, St. Tammany is the most represented parish. Compared to Summer 2014, Jefferson Parish had the largest increase (1.7%) in undergraduate enrollment. Livingston had the smallest percent decrease in graduate students with a decrease of 3.1%.
