



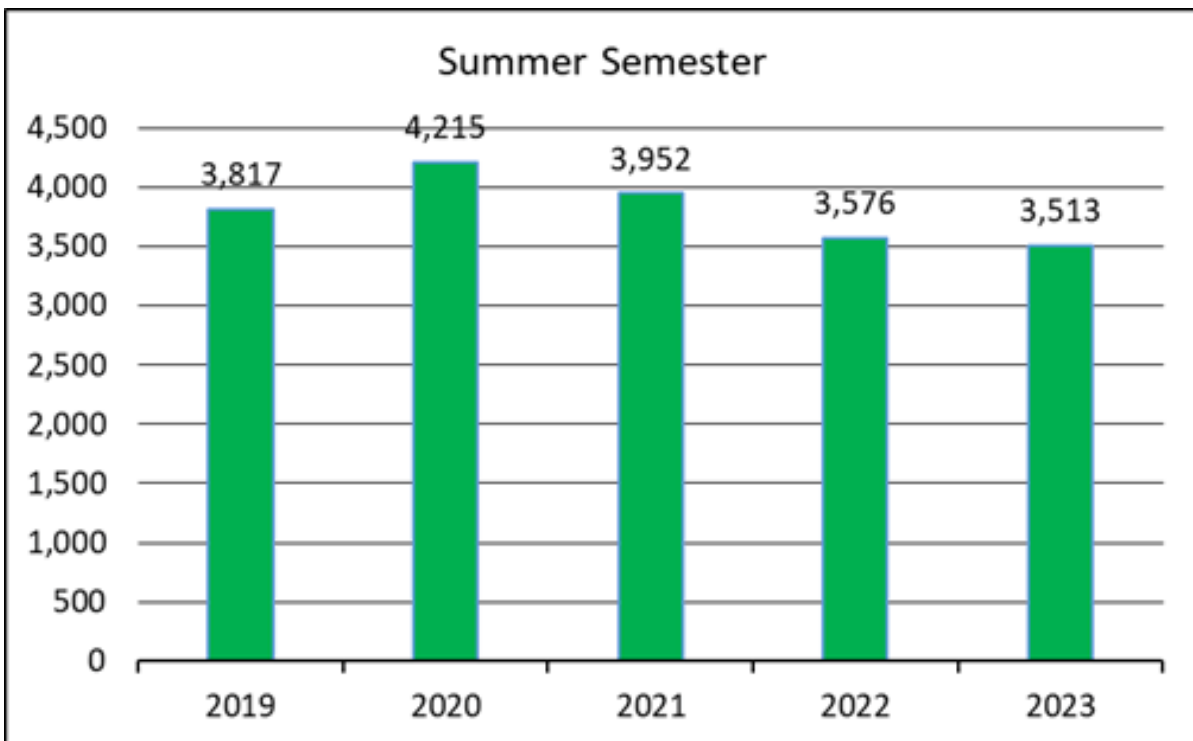

Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 1.8% from the Summer 2022 semester to the Summer 2023 semester. This reflects a 4.3% decrease in undergraduate enrollment and a 9.2% increase in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students increased slightly to 32.9% of total enrollment compared to 32.7% in Summer 2022.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 5.6 hours, which is the same as Summer 2022's 5.6 average. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 5.2 hours, which is a slight increase from 5.1 in Summer 2022. In Summer, a full-time undergraduate student is enrolled in 6 or more hours and full-time graduate students in 4 or more hours. Part-time undergraduate students are enrolled in less than 6 hours and graduate students in less than 4 hours.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score decreased slightly from 23.2 in Summer 2022 to 21.5 in Summer 2023.

These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 6, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 4.

Top Six Parishes

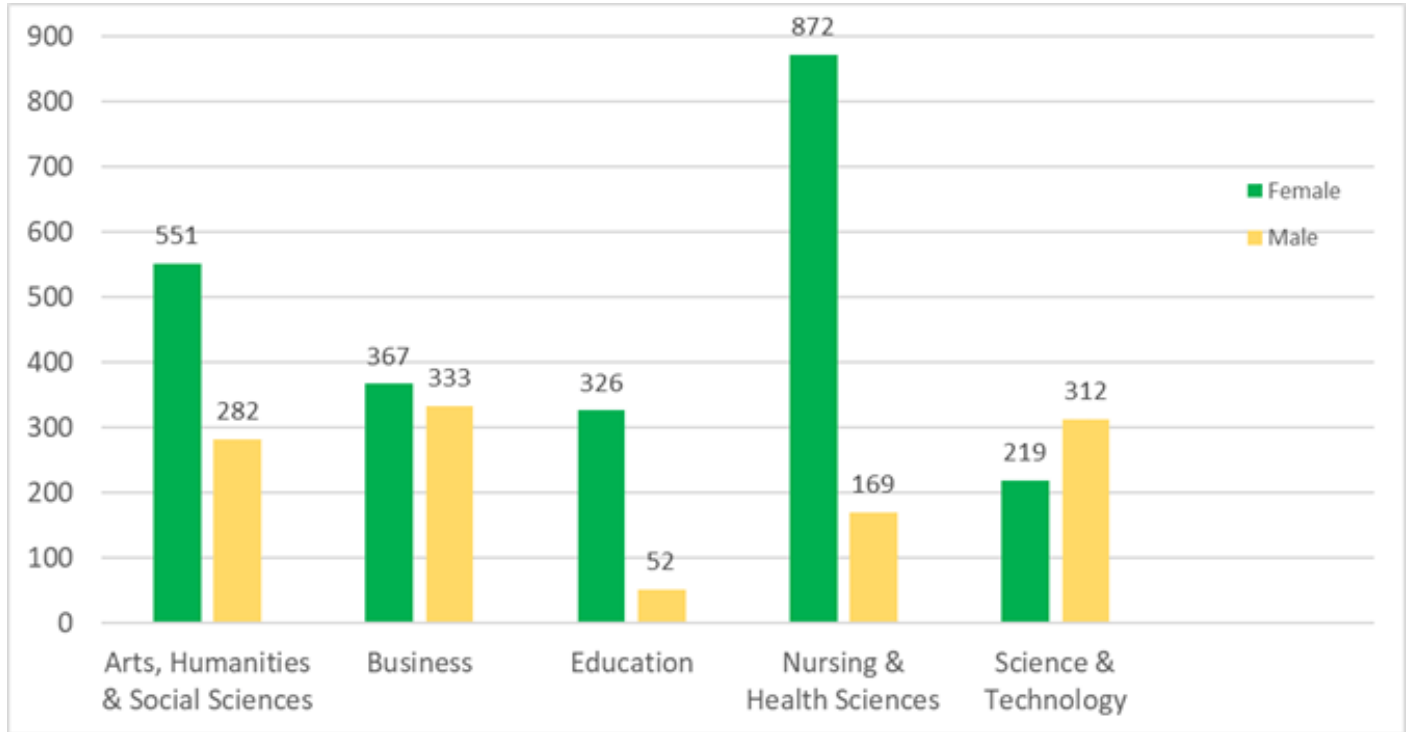
