## **Crisis Scenarios:**

- Language about ending one's life
- Evidence or report of self-harm
- Substance Use Emergency
- Hearing or seeing things not present-hallucinations
- Physical threats to someone else

For the above scenarios:

If you lose contact with the indiviudal or they do not wish to accompany you to the UCC, please call UPD immediately for further intervention (985) 549-2222.

Sexual Assault or Domestic Violence survivor

If this individual does not wish to make a report, seek counseling, or receive medical help:

- offer resources and report at selu.edu/reportit
   If they demonstrate any risk of harm to self or others:
  - escort to UCC or call UPD

For any crisis scenarios <u>AFTER HOURS</u>, contact UPD at (985) 549-2222 immediately.

If you feel anyone's safety is at risk, please call UPD at (985) 549-2222.



## How to proceed based on what information you have:

- If safe, escort them to the UCC
- Stay to inform the counselor on call
- If the individual is unwilling, call UPD immediately
- Call UPD immediately at (985) 549-2222
- Forward all supporting documentation to police@southeastern.edu

Gather information:

- Name, Location, W#, Any harm done?
- Contact UPD immediately
- Flag down a colleague if needed Try to keep the individual on the call

## What to do and say with someone in crisis:

- How can I best help you right now?
- Are you thinking about suicide?
- Can I walk with you to the Counseling Center so we can have someone help you?
- Explain they are not in trouble; UPD is a resource for everyone's safety.
- Take a deep breath yourself.
- Offer genuine listening without judgment.
