

DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

2025-2026 Academic Year

Southeastern Louisiana University, in partnership with local high schools, is pleased to offer qualified students an opportunity to enroll in college courses while still attending high school. Dual enrollment courses are hybrid courses with all content delivered online OR in person *via* a Southeastern Instructor/Professor. The high school teacher serves as a facilitator by assisting with student registration and enrollment, proctoring exams as necessary, and through supplemental instruction, serving as a daily learning resource for students as they assimilate course content. The Southeastern Instructor/Professor serves as the instructor of record for all dual enrollment courses. In order for students to enroll in Dual Enrollment courses, they must meet the Participation Criteria as outlined below and complete a Dual Enrollment application through SLATE. Please note that high school students can earn a maximum of 36 credits from Southeastern while participating in the Dual Enrollment Program.

NOTE: It is incumbent upon all students and parents to determine the transferability of Dual Enrollment courses to other institutions. For in-state institutions, Southeastern courses can be cross-referenced using the Statewide Articulation Matrix (https://www.laregents.edu/articulationandtransfer/) to determine transferability. Out-of-state institutions should be consulted to determine transferability.

Participation Criteria:

- Must be enrolled in the 10th, 11th or 12th grade at a public or private Louisiana high school during the 2025-2026 academic year.
- 10th graders may <u>not</u> enroll in ART 1060, ENGL 1010/1020, PHYS 1910, PSYC 1010 or SOC 1010
- Must have a minimum high school cumulative GPA ≥ 2.5 on a 4.0 scale (transcript must be provided)
- Complete a "Dual Enrollment Application" through SLATE (new students only).
- Meet the criteria below in order to take Humanities and Social Science courses and/or Science and Mathematics courses:

Placement for Humanities and Social Science Courses (ART, BIOL, COMM, EDCI, EDES, ENGL, HIST, MUS, PSYC, SOC, SPAN, THEA)	Placement for Science and Mathematics Courses (BIOL, CHEM, IT, MATH, PHYS)
 Pre-ACT English ≥ 18 or ACT English ≥ 18 or Pre-SAT Writing/Language ≥ 25 or SAT ERW ≥ 500 or ≥ 3 on any Humanities or Social Science AP exam that Southeastern accepts 	 Pre-ACT Math ≥ 19 or ACT Math ≥ 19 or Pre-SAT Math ≥ 500 or SAT Math ≥ 510 or ≥ 3 on any Math or Science AP exam that Southeastern accepts

 Continuing dual enrollment students with a cumulative Southeastern Dual Enrollment GPA ≥ 2.5, no application or paperwork will be required. The student will be continually eligible for all dual enrollment courses as long as a 2.5 dual enrollment GPA <u>AND</u> a 2.5 high school GPA are maintained.

Counselor Recommendation:

In the event that standardized exams have not been taken or the required test scores above cannot be met, a Counselor Recommendation may be used. Please note that the Counselor Recommendation must demonstrate at a minimum the following for the dual enrollment courses taken:

- Dual enrollment Humanities and Social Science courses require a C or above in the <u>last</u> high school English course taken before the dual enrollment course
- Dual enrollment Science and Mathematics courses require a C or above in the <u>last</u> high school math course taken before the dual enrollment course
- Dual enrollment Biology 1510 requires a C or above in the <u>last</u> high school English AND math course taken before the dual enrollment course

- A Counselor Recommendation may not be used to override the 2.5 high school GPA requirement. This is a minimum requirement as set forth by the Louisiana Board of Regents.
