Graduate Professional Education

One (20.0%) of the respondents is currently enrolled in a doctoral program. Two (40.0%) plan on enrolling in a doctoral degree program in the future and two (40.0%) have no plans for further education. Of the respondents with graduate experience, one (100.0%) felt that Southeastern "Very Ineffectively" prepared them for further graduate/professional. Of those who have earned a degree or enrolled in a program, one (100.0%) indicated the degree was "Very Closely Related" to their Master's degree.

Employment

All (100.0%) of the respondents are currently employed in K-12 education. Three (60.0%) are employed in the state of Louisiana. Two (40.0%) respondents indicated their education was "Very Effective" in preparing them for employment or improving their job performance, two (40.0%) indicated it was "Effective", and one (20.0%) indicated it was "Very Ineffective". Four (80.0%) of the respondents are employed in the area of their Southeastern master's degree and one (20.0%) in a related area. One (20.0%) respondent indicated a salary of less than \$20,000, one (20.0%) indicated a range of \$40,001-\$50,000, two (40.0%) indicated \$50,001-\$60,000, and one (20.0%) indicated \$60,001-\$70,000.

Overall Satisfaction with Southeastern

In general, respondents were satisfied with Southeastern. Forty percent (40.0%, n=2) had a Very Positive general attitude toward Southeastern, and an additional 40.0% (n=2) had a

Positive general attitude toward Southeastern. When asked if they would recommend Southeastern to a friend or family member considering graduate education, 60.0% (n=3) said they would with no reservations, 20.0% (n=1) indicated they would with some reservations, and 20.0% (n=1) indicated they would not under any circumstances.

The majority (80.0%, n=4) of the respondents indicated that if they were to do it again, they would elect to attend Southeastern for their Master's degree. Respondents were also asked if their college education had improved the quality of their life, regardless of the financial benefits. The majority (60.0%, n=3) of the respondents indicated that the quality of their life had not improved.
