Graduate Professional Education

Nine (36.0%) of the respondents are currently enrolled in a degree program, three plan on getting a Master's degree, two a Doctorate and four a professional degree. Six (24.0%) plan on enrolling in a degree program in the future, and ten (40.0%) have no plans for further education. Of the respondents with graduate experience, two (22.2%) felt that Southeastern "Very Effectively" prepared them for further graduate/professional, six (66.7%) felt that Southeastern "Effectively" prepared them, and one (11.1%) indicated they were "Ineffectively" prepared. Five (55.6%) indicated their program was "Very Related" to their Baccalaureate degree and four (44.4%) indicated it was "Somewhat Related".

Employment

Eighteen (72.0%) of the respondents are currently employed full-time, one (4.0%) is employed part-time and satisfied with part-time employment, one (4.0%) is employed part-time and looking for full-time employment, two (8.0%) have a graduate assistantship, one (4.0%) is unemployed and seeking employment, and one (4.0%) is unemployed but not looking for work. Of those who are employed full-time, sixteen (88.9%) of the alumni are employed in the state of Louisiana and two (11.1%) are employed out of state. One (5.6%) is employed in industry, four (22.2%) in business, one (5.6%) in higher education, two (11.1%) in a service organization, six (33.3%) in government, two (11.1%) in a professional firm, one (5.6%) in K-12 education, and one (5.6%) in a health agency. Four (22.2%) respondents indicated their education was "Very Effective" in preparing them for employment or improving their job performance, eleven (61.1%) indicated it was "Effective", and three (16.7%) indicated it was "Ineffective". Five (27.8%) of the respondents are employed in the area of their Southeastern bachelors degree,

four (22.2%) in a related area, and nine (50.0%) in an unrelated area. One (5.6%) respondent indicated a salary range of less than \$20,000, three (16.7%) indicated \$20,000-\$30,000, six (33.3%) indicated \$30,001-\$40,000, three (16.7%) indicated \$40,001-\$50,000, two (11.1%) indicated \$50,001-\$60,000, one (5.6%) indicated \$60,001-\$70,000, one (5.6%) indicated \$70,001-\$80,000, and one (5.6%) greater than \$80,000.

Overall Satisfaction with Southeastern

In general, respondents were satisfied with Southeastern. Thirty-two percent (32.0%, n=8) had a Very Positive general attitude toward Southeastern, and an additional 40.0% (n=10) had a Positive general attitude toward Southeastern. Six (24.0%) were Neutral towards Southeastern. When asked if they would recommend Southeastern to a friend or family member considering college, 44.0% (n=11) said they would with no reservations, nine (36.0%) would with some reservations, and four (16.0%) would with strong reservations.

Nineteen (76.0%) of the respondents indicated that if they were to do it again, they would elect to attend Southeastern for their baccalaureate degree, two (8.0%) would not, and three (12.0%) were undecided. Respondents were also asked if their college education had improved the quality of their life, regardless of the financial benefits. Nineteen (76.0%) of the respondents indicated that the quality of their life had improved.
