Graduate Professional Education

Three (18.8%) of the respondents has completed another degree, one a Master's and one a second baccalaureate. Two are currently enrolled in a degree program, one (6.3%) has taken courses but not enrolled in a degree program, three (18.8%) plan on enrolling in a master's program in the future, and seven (43.8%) have no plans for further education. Of the respondents with further educational experience, five (83.3%) felt that Southeastern "Effectively" prepared them for further graduate/professional. Of those in a degree program, three (60.0%) indicated their program was "Very Closely Related" to their Baccalaureate degree and one (20.0%) indicated it was "Somewhat Related".

Employment

Fifteen (93.8%) of the respondents are currently employed. Of those who are employed full-time, twelve (80.0%) of the alumni are employed in the state of Louisiana and three (20.0%) are employed out of state. Seven (46.7%) are employed in industry, two (13.3%) in business, one (6.7%) in higher education, four (26.7%) in a professional firm, and one (6.7%) in the military. Six (40.0%) respondents indicated their education was "Very Effective" in preparing them for employment or improving their job performance, eight (53.3%) indicated it was "Effective", and one (6.7%) indicated it was "Ineffective". Ten (66.7%) of the respondents are employed in the area of their Southeastern bachelors degree, four (26.7%) in a related area, and one (6.7%) in an unrelated area. Three (20.0%) respondents indicated a salary range of \$40,001-\$50,000, two (13.3%) indicated \$50,000-\$60,000, three (20.0%) indicated \$60,001-\$70,000, three (2.0%) indicated \$70,001-\$80,000, and four (26.7%) greater than \$80,000.

Overall Satisfaction with Southeastern

In general, respondents were satisfied with Southeastern. Thirty-eight percent (37.5%, n=6) had a Very Positive general attitude toward Southeastern, and an additional 50.0% (n=8) had a Positive general attitude toward Southeastern. One (6.3%) was Neutral towards Southeastern. When asked if they would recommend Southeastern to a friend or family member considering college, 31.3% (n=5) said they would with no reservations and ten (62.5%) would with some reservations.

Eleven (68.8%) of the respondents indicated that if they were to do it again, they would elect to attend Southeastern for their baccalaureate degree, one (6.3%) would not, and three (18.8%) was undecided. Respondents were also asked if their college education had improved the quality of their life, regardless of the financial benefits. Fourteen (87.5%) of the respondents indicated that the quality of their life had improved.
